Q: First, tell us something about yourself?

I'm a writer living in New Zealand, and I've written fiction, non-fiction and children's books. I'm crazy about books and think they are so important in people's lives. They inspire, educate and can be a lot of fun. I've written 19 books published in nine countries, and I get many cool invitations to speak at festivals and other events. I also review books and have fun appearing on radio and TV. Being an author is an adventure and is a career I can heartily recommend.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I've always loved reading and writing for as long as I can remember. By the age of ten, my short stories were being published in a national Sunday newspaper on the kids' page, so I was very fortunate to have an early start with being published.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

As mentioned, I wrote many stories when I was a child that were published. My first book as an adult was published in 2003, and my first book in the Elastic Island Adventures series for children was published in 2018.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

Elastic Island Adventures is a fantasy action-adventure book series set in the South Pacific. Kiri, Jed, and twins Emma and Ethan discover an 'elastic' island that sends them pinging across the ocean to a variety of destinations.

The books can be read in any order. In the latest adventure, *Flip Flop Bay*, Bob the Blue-Footed Booby is running a flying school, which sounded like fun until the children discover this means dressing in weird costumes and launching themselves off the end of the wharf. It's the latest silly idea in a series of doomed ventures from Bob the Blue-Footed Booby, who is trying to save their small fishing village from closure. Can the children come up with an idea that will save the island and its kooky inhabitants? And what about the complication of The Dastardly Captain Crook?

In each story, to survive, the children must work together, strengthening friendships and trust, learning resilience, confidence and new skills. The books are all about encouraging literacy in children too, and many reluctant readers have enjoyed the books.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?

I was inspired by Milla, the then 10-year-old in our family, who kept asking me when I would write a children's book. I suddenly realised I only had a small window to do this for her before she became a teenager. Our fun, family-friendly project ended up being a multi-book deal, and the movie rights have been optioned, so you just never know what might happen when you write a book! Since then, I've communicated with thousands of children, and I love engaging with them and hearing about their own creative endeavours.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

I came up with the idea of an elastic island that could transport people to exciting tropical destinations, and soon I had my four plucky children to go on the adventures. There is Kiri, who loves swimming and is a fabulous singer. She's outgoing and outspoken and tends to act before she thinks. Emma is her best friend, and she is shy, bookish and dreamy. She is kind and intelligent, but she doesn't want to go mountain climbing or anything dangerous. Emma has a twin brother, Ethan, who is very clever and he loves inventing things, although he can be a bit selfish. Jed is the new kid in town, and he loves sports, but he finds their adventures are stressful when things don't go to plan. Added into the mix from book two is Blong the Cat, a talking, dancing, very affectionate cat who can do 'Blong-a-Grams.' From book five, we meet Heathcliff the Dog, a wise philosopher who is loyal and kind.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

Not sure which Elastic Island Adventures book to read first? They can be read in any order, so read Jewel Lagoon if you like lots of danger and action-adventure. Like the idea of becoming invisible? Read Port Mugaloo. If you love art and colour, read Rainbow Cove. Prefer a bit of romance and like the idea of going to a wedding? Alphabet Resort is the book for you. Love cats? Well, there is an entire kingdom of them in Kingdom of Blong. Like the idea of flying or being a pirate? Then you will enjoy Flip Flop Bay. And for younger brothers and sisters, they will enjoy Blong the Cat's Costume Caper. There are costumes and dancing and also a counting element.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

Writing wasn't something that I ever considered pursuing but when I had my two beautiful daughters, I realized I had some stories to tell and I started writing. 'Ew,Goo!' and 'Belle meets Henry' are my first two books.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

'Belle Meets Henry' is actually the first book I wrote from start to finish. I completed the initial draft about 6 years ago but was unsure of how to move on to the next step. Then I was introduced to FoxPointe Publishing in early 2021 and the rest is history. While that story was in the review process, I wrote 'Ew, Goo!' Both of these books are scheduled for release this year, 'Ew, Goo!' in May and 'Belle Meets Henry' in June.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

'Ew, Goo!' is about a little girl whose runny nose just won't stop running. It is a humorous, rhyming children's book that follows the curly haired hero in her attempt to stem the flow of her goo! 'Belle Meets Henry' follows Belle the dog on her adventures in her neighborhood. In her first adventure, Belle meets Henry who is a heron. Henry wants to show Belle what the neighborhood is like from his perspective. They have to work together to figure out how to get Belle into the air. It is a story about working together to solve a problem and to learn about other people and their experiences.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?







GIVE A LITTLE SNUGGLE

Q: First tell us something about yourself?

I live in Iowa with my husband, 2 kids, and 3 dogs. I own a small, private music studio where I teach piano, voice, and ukulele. I'm also a health and life coach "on the side." I love to exercise, dark chocolate, and Mister Rogers. Above all else, my family is the most important thing in my life.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I started writing when I was about 8. I lived in a couple of group homes and a foster home that year. Our counselors taught us to keep a journal, to connect with our emotions. I'm in my 40s now and have kept one ever since.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

Oh, I don't remember, honestly. I think the "real" first "story" was my first book with Fox Pointe Publishing, Give a Little Snuggle. I was as shocked as anyone that they picked it up...first real attempt out of the gate!

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?

Well, to be honest, my books aren't just for kids. They really aren't meant for kids to go and read alone. They are meant for families to read together. Kids need support. But parents need it too. They need all the tools and support they can get, to raise healthy, well-adjusted, someday adults. For a child, NOTHING is more important than being connected to their caregivers. Nothing matters more to a child than knowing they are fully loved and accepted for who they are, and that their caregivers will always be there for them, no matter what. I had a very traumatic childhood. My family life was disjointed. I grew up never really knowing if I was loved or accepted for who I was. It made adulting challenging. And that's really what drives me. I don't want ANY child to ever experience what I did. And, I fully recognize that parents absolutely need support, too. I want parents to know that I get it. I understand all the struggles that come with parenthood. Parenthood is really another opportunity to heal our own wounds while paving the way for the future at the same time. 7 kidlioMag

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

I'm all about family books that help families connect over a multitude of difficulties. I would suggest that I try to cover the "basics" through a variety of avenues: illustrations, poetry, music, connection... There are so many life lessons to be learned. I think when our children, and their families, have certain foundational topics solid, it makes everything else a bit easier.

For instance, Give a Little Snuggle is all about things you can do to help your littles when they are sad, scared, or just had a bad day. It is designed for a parent to help connect with their child, in that moment, when nothing else seems to work. A little song, a little tickle, a little giggle, and a snuggle. It's poetic, it's musical (and even includes sheet music), the illustrations are colorful and all-inclusive, and there is even a page for parents that talks about the significance of positive touch for a child.

The Bedtime Rhyme is about creating a safe space for families to share and connect at the end of the day. A little story, a little listening, and a sweet lullaby to end (it includes sheet music as well). It's about complete acceptance of our growing charges, just the way they are. It is the very bedtime routine I've used with my kids since they were babies. And we still follow some version of this today.

And coming soon, Dear Mom & Dad is designed to help parents remember a bit about their own childhood. It's more like a storybook for kids to read to their parents when they are having a hard time saying what they want to say to their parents. It's also a song. So it can be read, or sung...the perfect combination of words and music to help Mom and Dad remember their own childhood, and thus further their connection and understanding with their own children.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

They are based on my experiences with my own children, students, and my own childhood. The books don't necessarily have specific characters. I asked my illustrator to be as inclusive as he could. I wanted to represent a multitude of children and families...different ethnicities, special needs, blended families. There's no one family in any book. Though, he does include my family in at least one or two pages in each book (my son is on the cover of Give a Little Snuggle, because it was really written for him, in the midst of a meltdown).

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

Parenting is challenging. But also rewarding. Take time to really connect with your littles. Listen, snuggle, remember... These are some of the most important parenting actions you could ever make. For you, and your children. Remember, we are always doing the best we can, with what we've got. Our kids are, too! And it is always okay to "look for the helpers," as Mister Rogers would say. It is my hope that I can be one of



Music soothes our souls, wiggles get the mad out, giggles lighten the load, and a snuggle brings a calm connectedness. Give a Little Snuggle is a story about your child. The delightful illustrations, text, and music, are created with all hearts in mind. It is a story about blue times and rough times, and the fear that comes with those times. It is a story that teaches children and adults alike, that though we may have blue times, rough times, and fearful times, there is always something we can do to ease our soul; connect with those we love and who love us.


When your child is sad or upset, you may find connecting difficult. Their "upsets" become yours, and soon you are at your wit's end. Nothing you try works to calm or connect. You may think your child wants to be left alone. But as a mother and educator, I can assure you what they really want and need, is connection.

This book helps you do just that: Connect when there is sadness, connect when it's been a bad day, connect when there is fear...

I wrote this as a song first, when my son was having a meltdown. No matter how hard I tried, he wouldn't "let me in." Out of desperation I just started singing. These are the words that came out.

Q: First tell us something about yourself?

I'm a New York City elementary school principal. I've been a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. I'm a colon cancer warrior and do lots of speaking engagements on the importance of people age 45 and older to get a colonoscopy as it could save their lives.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I started writing my books during chemotherapy sessions. When you get chemo, you're literally sitting for hours. I need to do something that keeps my mind on something else. I didn't want to focus on cancer or the

I first started recording myself reading books and posting it on my YouTube channel, Reading with Dr. Liz, as a way to stay connected to my school community. I was on medical leave for fourteen months and I missed my heartbeats (my scholars).

Our reading engagement declined during my absence and I thought that telling my own story of going from non-reader in first to an educator today with four degrees, might be a motivator.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

My first book, Little Lizzy Learns to Read, was written in 2019 but I didn't publish it until 2021. The writing process was my therapy to get through cancer. Once I was cancer free I forgot about it. My cancer came back and I went back to writing and self publishing.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?


Both of my books are based on my real life. My second book is about my first cancer journey. It was written to give hope to anyone impacted by cancer.


Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?










Absolute Animal Alliteration

Q: First tell us something about yourself?

I am an architect residing in Calgary, Alberta, Canada with my wife Nancy. I am a proud father of two, stepfather of two and grandfather of three.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I've been writing and illustrating stories since my childhood. I wrote a play in High School that included some musical numbers. My song writing has continued through the years, including some that I have posted on social media. I have always been creating. I just can't help myself!

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

I wrote quite a few silly stories and songs that remained unpublished. "Absolute Animal Alliteration" is my first published work (besides my Masters Degree Thesis for Architecture!). I created the book (wrote and illustrated) when my children were in Elementary School and presented to their classrooms. But it was another 20 years before I fine-tuned it and prepared it for publication (2021).

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

"Absolute Animal Alliteration" is intended to be visually appealing, entertaining and educational. It is all about animals and alliteration, which are things that seem to resonate well with children. The word play is fun and the animals bring it to life!

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader ? is there any specific reason?

I have always enjoyed entertaining (and sure, educating) children. I think kids need to be more engaged in reading. This book catches their attention and teaches them about the power of the alphabet. I originally wrote it for my own children but it has now become a favorite of my grandchildren. And it is fun for parents, grandparents and teachers as well!

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

Animals are fascinating and quite fun to draw. I loved cartooning ever since my childhood. This book allowed me an outlet for my gift. The idea of presenting each character within an alliterative phrase was just icing on the cake!

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

It has been a very tumultuous couple of years in our world. I empathize with children who have had to adjust to the constraints of the Covid Pandemic. I am hoping that this book will add some enjoyment and whimsy back into the daily routine of families. It can provide a focus on something colorful, creative and engaging while also being an element of the art of learning.




This Kid Can Hyperfocus

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

Beyond my 3rd grade book, in 2016, when I turned 52, I decided to take on a writing quest. I wrote a weekly story for 52 weeks, every week focusing on one person I was grateful for in my life. I published the stories on WordPress for my audience to enjoy. I had readers around the globe cheering me on my weekly journey. My hope was to inspire others to take on such a writing challenge. Those were my first published pieces. They were motivational articles for real estate agents. In 2021, the idea of Welcome Home! was born while sitting on my couch. The concept poured out of me. I got emotional when I wrote the last few words. I birthed my first real book. I just knew I needed to find a phenomenal illustrator and get this book out into the world for families moving with children. Janette Hill, my brilliant illustrator, (You can find her on Instagram @janettehillart), brought my book to life. She listened to every detail and feeling I wanted to portray on the pages. I can never thank her enough for partnering with me on this book journey. She even included dogs, birds and squirrels throughout the book-because I love them so much!

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

Welcome Home! is the first release under Storyteller's Publishing. My husband is also a writer, so we have started our own publishing company. I wrote Welcome Home! to help children who are moving. I wanted them to know everything will be okay. They should take a deep breath and let go of their anxiety. Adults purchasing a new home are typically excited, while the kids are a bit apprehensive. I noticed this as I sold homes to young families. I wanted to find the perfect gift that I could give the kids while handing over the keys to their family. It didn't exist. Now it does! Not only have I written a book to ease the minds of children moving, I've created a thoughtful gift for real estate agents to leave a long lasting impression. The last page of the book has a space for a family photo to be inserted, marking the momentous occasion for the family.
