Q: First tell us something about yourself?

I am a mother to an amazing 6 year old daughter, an early childhood educator, a certified yoga instructor, and the author of the new children's book On Brighter Days. I am originally from Chicago but currently live in Columbia, South Carolina with my husband, daughter, and our dog, Nia.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I have been keeping journals ever since I could write. On every family vacation or trip we took, Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader ? Is there any specific reason? I would record all the things we did, saw, and experienced. I liked writing everything down and then reading over it later to reminisce. As an early childhood educator, I am obsessed with high quality children's books. There are so many great stories being written that really grab children's attention and open their eyes to the world. However, there is a lack of quality children's books for only children and families that struggle with secondary infertility so I hope to fill in that missing demographic with On Brighter Days. Every child and family should be asks questions related to them. Books are her window to the world and when we couldn't represented in books so they can see their reflection.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

I wrote my first book in August 2021 and with the help of my wonderful editor and publisher, it was released in May 2022.

Q: Tell us something more about your book?

The inspiration for the book, On Brighter Days, came from my personal struggle with second- Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers? ary infertility. I am the youngest of five children and wanted my daughter to have siblings. We started trying for another child when she was about two years old. After many doctors Children often want things they can't always have whether it be a pet, a toy, or even a appointments and failed attempts, I found out I wouldn't be able to have any more children without expensive and invasive medical interventions because of fibroids.

When I realized we would not be able to have more kids, I began to look for books for my daughter to explain our experience to her and make sense of it since she asked almost everyday for a sibling. The bookshelves were empty. There were only a few books about being an only child and only one about secondary infertility. I am passionate about high quality children's literature and so we decided to write our own book addressing these feelings for other parents and only children. A therapist I worked with said that this would help both of us process our complex feelings. Now I get to share it with families who also may be struggling with infertility.

As a teacher of early childhood for 12 years, I am a huge fan and collector of children's literature. Children's books are a great way to explain to young people about the diversity of people and viewpoints in their world. Kids should see themselves reflected in the books they read. My daughter is heavily influenced by the books that what we read and she often find one about our experience, we decided to write our own.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

The characters are based on my daughter's experience as an only child as well as other only children we've met. I wanted to make sure the book showed a variety of only child familiesfrom ones with two parents who are a man and a woman, gay couples, parents from every racial background, and single parents.

On Brighter Days

On Brighter Days focuses on only children and their feelings about wanting a sibling but ultimately realizing how lucky they are to be in a small loving family. It is pretty universal that children ask for things they want but that may not be possible (a puppy, a new toy, or a sibling). This book highlights the importance of appreciating all the wonderful things that children do have in their families, no matter the size.

She boasts a 43-year nursing career that started at the age of 17 as an LPN (licensed practical nurse) and pursued her education until she became an ARNP. Iselyn has worked in nearly every field of Maternal Child, including but not limited to OB, Neonatal NICU, Newborn Nursery, and many more, so children and women have always been her passion and love. Her love of children led her to become a self-published children's book author in October 2021. To date Iselyn has published three children's book in a 4-book series: MIMI, MEMA, YAYA, GAGA, NANA, GRANNY, BIG MAMA AND ME, and CHRISTMAS WITH MIMI, MEMAW, YAYA, GAGA, NANA, GRANNY, BIG MAMA AND ME. Both books are an ode to grandmothers and the celebration of the love they have for their grandchildren. Iselyn's newest book; DIFFERENT THAN ME, was inspired by a grandmother's love of her grandchild of a different nationality who was adopted into her family. The book celebrates that love has no racial boundaries because love can be different than you.

Iselyn is a 16-year breast cancer survivor and thriver. Her breast cancer diagnosis prompted her to start a non-profit organization I'M A SURVIVOR INC in 2007, and to spend the next year as the president of the Tampa chapter of Sisters Connected, the only national African American breast cancer organization. Both organizations mission is to support underinsured and uninsured women emotionally and financially. The organizations coordinate yearly fundraisers to raise funds for mammograms and financial assistance to women diagnosed with breast cancer. IM A SURVIVOR INC is hoping to become more active soon as Iselyn now resides in SC.

Iselyn is also the founder and CEO of Duckling to Diva LLC, (formerly Duckling to Diva INC) a young women's empowerment organization. The organizations mission is to empower and educate young women on self-esteem, finances and more to help them to navigate this ever-changing world with success.

Iselyn is the mother of two amazing adult children and the grandmother of two very busy and active two-year-old twins. Iselyn loves spending time with family and close friends. She spends her quiet time writing and reading. She loves music, concerts, traveling and spending time at the beach. To know her is to love her; she doesn't meet a stranger.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I started my journey as a children's book author in October of 2021, but I started writing in 2006 after being diagnosed with breast cancer. I was a contributing author in a compilation book entitled Fueled By Greatness.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

My first children's book was written and published in October of 2021. I have written and published two more books sine then.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

My children's book series MIMI and Me captures the joys of grand motherhood from multicultural perspectives, and my new book DIFFERENT THAN ME, is a cute picture book that celebrates and embraces the love of multicultural families and their traditions and cultures. This book shows children that love can come from someone that looks different than them and that no matter the race, culture, or traditions love is still love in any and every language.

"Diversed In STEM" is an inspiring and easy to read children's book. This book goes into detail about self-knowledge and that anything is possible and can be created.

This book teaches children about different possible STEM Careers. Q: First tell us something about yourself?

My name is Rich Gilliam and I'm from Philadelphia, Pa. I'm located in North Carolina where I have resided since going to college at Saint Augustine university. I'm a robotic engineer and I love using my creativity to streamline processes. Some of my favorite things to do are cook, watch and go to live sporting events. And travel while capturing sceneries and amazing memories.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My journey as a writer actually started when I first graduated from college. I always enjoyed writing down my thoughts that come to me and telling short stories. For years I didn't really believe in the content or stories that I would write. Over the past few years I realized that I have to let fear just take the wheel and go for it. I came with the thinking that it would be selfish of me to not realize content that could actually have a positive impact on people's lives. So in 2021 I decided to pursue getting my first book "Diversed In STEM" published.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

"Diversed In STEM" is my first story and was published on my birthday April 14th

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

My book "Diversed In STEM" is a children's book for target audience 6-12 years old. As well as educators, parents and individuals interested in STEM as a whole. Not only does my book go into areas of STEM and a list of many different areas of STEM that one may go into. My book goes into the unique qualities that one may have that they or someone else may look down upon can actually be positive. When we or have someone help us realize are unique qualities this can be used to our advantage.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader ? is there any specific reason?

I choose kids as my reader because I feel there are a large number of children that deal with self confidence issues. I wanted to create content for kids to actually see that they are unique no matter what personality they have. With the large amount of stem careers that are coming in the future. I feel it's important for kids to understand what they can do when they get older, and especially to know how to build on the qualities they currently have.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

That is a great question! I ask myself the same thing sometimes. The story of Diversed In STEM really came from my life. With years of experience working in the STEM field I have been fortunate to work with many different cultures and I have seen the impact of of how diversity can impact collaboration. The characters in Diversed In STEM are from all different backgrounds and all have unique qualities. But they learn that they can build up each other and learn from each other. When I first started to write "Diversed In STEM" I just begin to think about all the amazing people from different cultures that I worked with. My love for STEM and want for more diversity for people that look and come from areas like me to see themselves in STEM was a big factor of me coming up with the story.

AUTHOR INTERVIEW Bella's BIC (aribbean Adventure

Q: First tell us something about yourself?

Hello there, and first of all thank you for giving me a chance to contribute to your magazine.

Okay, so I love being a mum of two to my son and daughter, I have always loved writing and reading novels. Before writing I worked for many years as an I.T. administrator in the city of London, I love plant-based food, I make sure I do 10K steps at least most days of the week, I just started a tap-dancing beginners class and my favourite cities in the world are Paris and LA.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My writing journey began in 2007. Subconsciously it may have started way before that when I was in primary school and then a young adult. As a kid, I read everything for my age group. As a young adult, I devoured the entire Sweet Valley High series, Caitlyn Loving You series, and more. All that while little did I know I was absorbing story structure, characters, dialogue, world-building, and description. However, the urge for creative writing started in 2007 when I worked as a receptionist for an architectural firm. The phone hardly rang so I remember writing many scenes at my desk at the seat of my pants. Not only did this feel good to create scenes and be in charge of what happened to these characters, but soon after it became my hobby for many years and I've never stopped until the opportunity came for me to self-publish.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

My first published story was in November 2017. Having acquired an interest in writing in 2007, I was not trying to get published all that time. From 2007 to 2017 I was learning my craft, and trying to learn everything. The story I first published started as a bit of homework from a writing group I attended in 2016. It was a brilliant class and I kept enrolling every term until I was there for an entire year. A year after the class finished, I found the short story, extended it by another four thousand words, and decided to self-publish it in November 2017. That short story became part one of a three-part series.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

Everything I have published so far has been inspired by my life; my close friends, my professional author friendship circles (that inspired The Big Event) my kids who I adore, our adventures, news stories, places I have been, and funny questions my kids have asked me over the years. The Caribbean island of St Vincent is the backdrop to book two, Bella's Big Caribbean Adventure. I used to live there and always had it in mind to one day write about the island in a creative setting and to let people know more about how beautiful it is. Also, everything I have published was only supposed to be a one-off story, but somehow always ended up as a series. I felt comfortable writing about Bella and her friends as they are roughly the same age as my kids with similar personality traits and humor. Annabelle is my co-writing partner and brainstorming buddy. When we work together we love to use the Save the Cat beat sheet to plan out our scenes. Annabelle has always been a central part of our stories and after many discussions, some of her ideas helped shape a handful of scenes and character motives.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your readers? Is there any specific reason?

I love writing for this age group as it's fun and engaging and at this age, there are so many first lessons to be learned. I enjoy delivering the story lessons or certain themes through the eyes of these children's characters. There are so many exciting middle-grade books out there and I love them as much as my daughter does. What's also nice is Annabelle and I mostly share our reading lists and discuss what we loved about the books.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

The inspiration for the Bella series started with a trip to London's annual Winter Wonderland theme park in November 2019. It's always held at Christmas time and it was here Annabelle thought how exciting to write a story about a girl who has an amazing adventure while visiting a theme park. After we finished the first book we had an idea to write a summer follow-up, Bella's Big Caribbean Adventure, and yes, we are working on a third for summer 2023. As for how the characters came to mind, Tommy and Iris who is Bella's best friends came naturally. Every little girl needs a best friend. We wanted to include a boy as part of the friendship circle to offer a different dynamic, and Iris, who compliments Bella. The supporting characters such as Granny Sylta are based on my late mother and grandmother to Annabelle whom we adored and wanted to make a part of our stories. Granny Sylta's character traits are the same in real life as they are in the books. She loved burgundy, loved to knit, had a sense of humour, enjoyed cooking coconut bakes, and was the heart of my family.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

There will be more stories from Bella and her friends and we cannot wait to bring you the third instalment. Our books are available on Amazon and recently, in two bookshops in London; New Beacon Books and Owl Bookshop.
