

Q: First, tell us something about yourself?

My name is Maryam Chehrazad. I'm an Iranian American first-time children's author. I have a PhD in International Law focusing on "Arctic Environmental Protection." I'm an environmentalist and an animal lover.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

This journey is based on my personal experiences. I began as a volunteer in a children's cancer hospital in 2008, where I learned the value of educating young children and their thirst for understanding the world.

Years later, in 2016, I joined the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs to work on marine biodiversity and ocean pollution. Studying and working in this area and my background working with kids led me to a life-changing decision that the best way to pass on my knowledge is to empower and educate children on environmental issues.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

I consider myself more of a storyteller. I always daydreamed but never wrote anything down until I met my husband, who encouraged me to

What The Seal Saw



Q: First tell us something about yourself?

I live in beautiful White Rock, B.C., Canada where I love to experience nature - especially from my kayak! Every page of this book was written from my real-life observations of seals in Semiamhoo Bay. When I'm not writing or kayaking, I love working in technology. I am currently a Sr Manager of Business Analysis and enjoy seeing where technology and creativity connect.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

I've always been a writer. I have journals and poems that go back to my elementary school days. I've written several novels and short stories; I have notebooks of poetry, song lyrics, and ideas scattered around my house (and even my car!). But being a published writer is another thing altogether! As I was approaching my 50th birthday, I hired a career coach and consulted authors and other experts to figure out how I could succeed in my demanding day job and also be a published author. During this time, I was out kayaking when a seal popped up and looked around. I spontaneously spoke to the seal and it came out in rhyming verse: "Hey there seal! What do you see? I see you? Do you see me?" I immediately realized that this would be a great children's book. So, I started to write it. Every time I went out on the water, I'd observe what was happening and each page of the book is based on a real-life experience - even the whale! I wanted to capture that universal moment where you see an animal in nature and wonder if it sees you, and what else it sees!

Fun fact - I wrote this book almost entirely in my kayak. I used the voice recorder on my phone in its waterproof pack. I wonder how many books have been written while the author was paddling!]

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

Here are some of the ideas within the book:

I.D.E.A (Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Access). It was important that the voice of the book be represented by a character that any child could identify with. The illustrated child has no discernible gender, age, race, or ethnicity. This allows all of our readers to see themselves in the story. One of the great delights of introducing the book to children has been to see the variety of little ones who've pointed at the pages and said "that could be me!".

Leading with Curiosity I did not intend to write an anti-anxiety book. But, in hindsight, that's exactly what I did. It stands to reason as it was written almost entirely in my happy place – my kayak! It's impossible to be anxious and curious at the same time. By emphasizing a message of leading with curiosity, the book creates a calm and thoughtful mindset. As the poem ends where it begins, there is a satisfying synergy to the story.

Environmental Empathy The seal in this book is not anthropomorphized. It has no name or gender; it does not wear human clothing or conduct human activities. Instead, the book presents a gentle message of care-taking of our environment, living in the moment, and approaching the world with empathy. Every scene in this book is taken from real-life observations of the behaviours of seals in Semiamhoo Bay, British Columbia.

Have you ever seen an animal in nature?

Maybe it was a deer, or an owl, or a bunny, or a seal.

Did you have a magical moment where you were looking at them and they were looking at you?

Did you wonder what they saw?

Did you wish you could follow your new friend?

Explore a world of wonder through the pages of this engaging story and you, too, can see What The Seal Saw.

Nurturing a love of Language I wanted to respect my young readers by using exactly the right word – even if it was above their expected reading level. It's been rewarding to see a 10-year old sound out the word 'scuttle' until they got it and to also see an 8-year old sail through the word kaleidoscope with no trouble. I know 2-year olds who ask for "Sea Saw". And, I know adults who appreciate the alliteration (Bubbles and Barnacles!), lyricism, and other poetic devices.


Nurturing a love of Nature Carla Maskall and I are so grateful to live in the Pacific Northwest near the ocean. We made a conscious decision to lovingly and faithfully depict this beautiful ecology. Many of the illustrations in the book started as pictures I took from my kayak. Our hope is that by exploring our own backyard with curiosity, we would foster a love of nature wherever our readers are.]

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?

I didn't choose kids as my readers initially. But once I realized that I had a good idea for a children's book, it was really important for me to write one with respect. I really tried to return to my childhood and write the kind of book that I love to read. I love poetry and think it's a shame that rhyming verse has gone out of fashion. (I mean, look what Shakespeare did with it!) Also, as a parent, I know how exhausting it can be to read the same book over and over again. So, I wove in concepts and literary devices that would be fun and interesting for adults. When I see the wide range of people who respond to the book, I know that it isn't limited to age range suggested by the publisher.]

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

My mission is to nurture a love of nature and language in little ones with big imaginations. I hope this book (and the ones to follow) inspire connections and conversations about interacting with nature. 




THE MERMAID OF GRAND'ANSE

CHOCOLATE PEANUT

- 1. Take 1 tbsp of ghee in a pan and roast the peanut on low flame for a few minutes.
- 2. Now take another pan and heat the remaining ghee and sesame seeds until the rawness is removed on low flame.
- 3. Now mix the crushed peanuts and grind sesame seeds paste and mix well keeping on low flame.
- 4. Now add the GHOCOLATE to it and mix well.
- 5. Then add half of the jaggery and mix.
- 6. Now add cardamom powder and mix well. Keep on low flame for a few minutes and off the stove.
- 7. Take the mixture out of the stove and let it cool for some time.
- 8. Now take some dough into your hand and put some chocolate and make it in the form of a ladoo.
- 11. Mix the sesame seeds into **COCONUT** powder.
- 12. Now roll the ladoo in this mixture and coat it.
- 13. Do the same with remaining dough and serve them. Enjoy!







Baby Worries

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

I was a primary school teacher for 20 years, working in Australia and the UK. Whilst teaching in England, I started to write educational articles for Scholastic magazines and then they commissioned me to write some books for them. I now have over 90 teacher resource books published with Scholastic, Oxford University Press, Folens, MA Education, Hopscotch, Parragon and Blake Education. I returned to Australia in 2015 and now live in Tasmania.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

When I was 9 years old I had a very supportive teacher who encouraged me to write. I created little story books for the classroom library! My first teacher resource book was published in 1992.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

I wrote two educational picture books in 2021, Monster Counting Book 1 to 20 and Noisy Animal ABC. Then I wrote A Dinosaur Came To My Birthday Party which was published in January 2022. All three books were self-published and are available on Amazon. My latest book, Baby Worries, is my best book yet! It is being launched on Kickstarter from 27th September until the end of October 2022.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

I like to write fun books that have an educational aspect to them. I believe that children should enjoy reading and learning so I try to make my books as entertaining as possible.

Baby Worries is about a baby who meets his extended family for the first time and starts to worry about what he might look like when he grows up. His imagination runs away with him and he imagines the craziest things! The book can be enjoyed for sheer entertainment but can also be used as a discussion starter to talk about feelings/ worries. I have created several printable activity packs and parent/ teacher guides to go with each book.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?

I was a teacher for many years and I love sharing things with kids and reading kids' books. I especially love picture books so I have always wanted to write my own.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

When my nephew brought his baby son to meet his family at one of our family get togethers, the look on the baby's face was hilarious. He looked at everyone with a very quizzical face as if to say 'Who on earth are you lot?' It set my own imagination spinning and 'Baby Worries' was created.



Strange Trips and and Weird Adventures



John Walker Pattison

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

John Walker Pattison was born in the wonderful seaside town of South Shields 65 years ago. He is a long-suffering, yet dedicated Newcastle United supporter; however, there is little doubt that the crucial hinge in John's life, is his beautiful wife, June. "Nothing is more important than family," says John.

He recently retired from his post as a senior clinical nurse specialist and Macmillan nurse in haematology at his local hospital, a place that established his cancer diagnosis over 48 years ago; at that time his parents were told that he would not survive, yet here he is today, humbled to be one of the longest living cancer survivors in the UK today.

Pattison has recently completed his memoirs, 'Me, and My Shadow – memoirs of a cancer survivor' which will be published in late 2022.

His first children's book, 'Strange Trips and Weird Adventures' is the first in a series of adventures of Daniel and Papa; available to a worldwide audience and will be followed by 'Blenkinsop Blabbermouth and the Ghost of Broderick McCaffery, then, 'The Fastest Water Pistol in Splodge City.' His fourth title, 'The Kingdom of Huckleberry Jam,' was recently completed.

He enjoys the solitude and escapism of fly fishing and photographing Native Americans. More significantly, he found solace throughout his cancer journey in the history, and spirituality of the Lakota Sioux Nation. In 2018, he would spend time on Pine Ridge Indian Reservation with the indigenous people of South Dakota, the people who, unknowingly, supported him through his, and life's greatest challenge, cancer.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

Due to the pandemic and his chronic illnesses as a consequence of the salubrious chemotherapy and radiotherapy he received decades earlier, he decided to put pen to paper and document the elasticated stories he has been telling his grandchildren for many years.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

'Strange Trips and Weird Adventures' was published in July 2022 by Austin Macauley. It is the first of four books that are completed, with a planned fifth started recently.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

Pattison's books are intended to capture the imagination of young children - a mix of escapism, adventure, and of course magic. The books all feature Daniel, an eleven-year-old born with the gift of intrigue, and his best friend Papa, who has a different story for every day. After all, no one, but no one, could tell a tale like Papa, not even Pinocchio. But no matter where the intrepid duo go, trouble is never far away.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?

Pattison has the philosophy that; 'Amazing children love amazing stories.' These books have been written with that in mind, and he is determined to bring a smile to the faces of children around the world. Pattison wants children to feel as though they are part of the adventure. Since the publication of his first book, he has undertaken well over a dozen school visits to talk about his work and read extracts. Just seeing the faces of the children is worth more than ANY royalty cheque, says John.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

John Walker Pattison has been telling his Grandchildren of his exploits for many years - like the time he climbed Mount Everest barefoot and captured the Abominable snowman before letting him go again, or the time he flew a sherbet-fuelled rocket to Jupiter. Not to mention his time in the FBI, or how he won the world's greatest steeplechase, The Grand National, on a donkey called 'Slowcoach.' All true stories...



Q: First tell us something about yourself?

I am a happy mom of two little kids. I enjoy reading storybooks and cookbooks.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

As a child I enjoyed creative writing which was something I did a lot with my mom. As an adult, before having children of my own, I allowed life to get in the way of my dreams. I built a career in healthcare and my husband and I put off having children. We worried about "getting our lives on the right track."

At 35 we were expecting our son and I started walking daily. Creative ideas started popping into my mind which I jotted down in the notes section of my phone. After my son was born every time my good friend or mom came for a visit they always brought a new picture book for us. Before long I was reading 20 or more books to my baby every day. We all enjoyed it immensely. This motivated me to turn my "notes" in my phone into stories. Within a short time I had so many stories written. Unfortunately my maternity leave was over all too soon and I had to return to work. My stories sat on my computer for the next year. Another year went by and then our daughter Autumn was born. Between feedings and sleepless nights I started to work on my stories again. After polishing a few I found Tellwell Talent publishing and the rest is history

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

My first story was written in 2019. It is not published. Not all of my stories are meant for publishing. Some of the process is just about getting the creative ideas out and not losing them or the idea. Sometimes I come back months later and turn them into something different. That's how "Be Wild" happened.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

Most of my books are about my own childhood stories about myself or my family. I write about my life or what I know then turn those ideas into short story books.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?

Reading books and telling stories is our favourite time of day. I enjoy children's stories so much that right now writing for children is my focus. Having children of my own motivated me to realize what is really important in life and that is storytell-

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

The character Teresa, in "Be Wild" is based on my own childhood stories. Teresa is my middle name so I thought that was a good name for the main character. Over the years my nephews have always enjoyed hearing family stories. They laughed so much learning how wild I was as a child. I thought there must be other kids who are, or were just as wild as I was and would like to hear a story about being wild and active. Now I'm bringing those stories to life.










Author Interview
