Happy Thanksgiving!



Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?



Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?




Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

Q: First tell us something about yourself?

Hi there, my name is Mariam Latifi and I am Australian-Afghan author based in Sydney Australia. I was born in Afghanistan and raised in Australia. I am a wife and a mother to three beautiful girls. I had graduated from the University of Sydney (B.Ed (Primary) and have been working as a primary school teacher for over a decade specialising in Teaching English to speakers of other languages. I am also a community activist/volunteer. I am passionate about making a positive difference in my community and empowering young children. I had recently won the NSW Local Women of the Year 2022 Award for my contribution and volunteer work in my community and as well as an Honorary Award for my distinctive role in the

community in supporting and promoting children's cultural identity and understanding. So, you can tell I love giving back to my community and making a difference. I love reading, writing and doing lots of hands-on and fun activities with my kiddies! I love watching my footy (Go the Eels!!!) and love to play cricket! Hove baking and making sweet treats!

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I had always LOVED reading and making up short stories and writing it for my girls. One day my eldest daughter asked questions about her faith, culture and identity and I was looking for some great children's book to inspire and read to her but found that unfortunately there was a lack of it. So, I was determined to write a children's book where she will see diverse representations and feel proud and connected by it and that is how my journey as a writer began with self-publishing my first children's book "A to Z of Mini



Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

I had began writing my first children's book last year when we were in lockdown (in May 2021). At that time, I was also studying for my final semester of my Masters degree in TESOL (through distance at Monash University). While writing my first book, I was also very busy with my 3 young girls (who were under 5 at that time) and with continuing my volunteer work for my community by running a children's playgroup. My book was independently published in November 2021 (so in about 6 months I was able to successfully self-publish my first children's book. My books is available in three formats (eBook, Paperback and Hardcover), all available through Amazon, Barnes & Noble, Target, Dymocks Angus & Robertson, Booktopia, Book Depositary and many others.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

My children's book "A to Z of Mini Muslims: An alphabet book exploring all about Islam and being a Muslim" is about teaching and empowering young children to be proud of their faith, culture, and identity. It focuses on teaching children all about the Islamic faith with using child-friendly language and captivating illustrations. It is not just an ordinary alphabet book but a book with key messages of promoting religious awareness, tolerance, diversity and inclusivity. It helps dispel myths and stereotypes and is a valuable resource for teachers, students, parents, schools and libraries in promoting and enhancing children's religious world views as aligned to our Australian Curriculum. My "A to Z of Mini Muslims" has become an Award-Winning book receiving the Literary Titan Gold Award and was an Award-Winning Finalist in the Children's Religious category of the 2022 International Book Award and also a

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?



Indeed my "A to Z of Mini Muslims" uses diverse representation of characters including embedding Australian themes and perspectives with references to the Australian landmarks, flora and fauna (which I absolutely love!). All this has been beautifully and meticulously illustrated by Saba Yasmeen.

Absolutely! To read you plant a seed, that seed will grow enabling you to succeed. So life is full of opportunities; take your chance and you will be amazed at where it leads. 

Q: First tell us something about yourself?

Personally, I am an MS warrior. I've battled and lived with this chronic neurological disease for over 30 years, with the support of my husband and our beautiful grown children. I am a retired elementary school teacher and former registered nurse, and now I proudly have entered the challenging and rewarding field of evolving as a children's author.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My journey began over 25 years ago, after the birth of our daughter Clarissa. All parents of infants are sleep-deprived and happily overwhelmed by their little bundle of joy! My exhausted state allowed the characters of Messy Marvyn, Hungry Hannah, Cheery Clairey, Picky Paul, and Chatty Patty to pop into my imagination. Over the course of a few weeks, the characters seemed to be interacting, and in the end, a short cartoon reel of the first book began to play over and over again in my imagination. Finally, one day as my daughter napped, I wrote the story based on the plot line. This story would take over 25 years to see the light of day as my first book in the series. The first book is titled Messy Marvyn's Rainy Day Fun. As each book went into production for printing and distribution, another character friend would step forward, and their cartoon reel would begin to unfold slowly. Now, I'm accustomed to the process, and I'm no longer surprised when a character steps forward with their own story. My role is to embellish each story based on my journey as a mother and a teacher. For me to become an author, I needed more than a plot line. I needed to experience being a mom and a teacher. I needed to see the friendships and bonds that children form, whether they were positive or negative. I also use my understanding of age-appropriate curriculum and learning goals to guide my stories for each age group as the series grows with my readers as they get older. Opening the cover of each of my books is like a continuation and re-connection with dear friends.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

The story was written over 25 years ago, but around the time of the onset of the Covid health pandemic, the manuscript reappeared, and then I misplaced it again in my home. This had been my normal experience and ongoing experience that continued for over two decades and five family moves. One day, it fell off my closet shelf as I was purging and re-organizing. It fell off a shelf and landed on my right foot. I took this as a sign, and it was "go time!"

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

Each book in the series encourages the reader to reflect upon what it means to be a good friend. How can you be a good friend? The plot lines and fun adventures of the characters show that true friendship does not include judging, bullying, or exclusion. Messy Marvyn & Friends are about a group of friends from diverse backgrounds who have their own quirky personalities. Their differences don't matter. The characters accept each other just as they are and have fun along the way. Their friendships are based on caring, acceptance, and kindness. The families of the characters are also loving and supportive of their children. The parents include racially mixed marriages, a strong and loving single mom, a two-mom family, and extended families. Messy Marvyn and Friends is a series that focuses on inclusion.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? Is there any specific reason?

I love being a Mom. It's the hardest but most rewarding journey of my life. My students were also my kids, and I adored them! I observed the learning journey of all of my children as they learned to read and write. I encouraged a lifelong love of literacy. Now that my kids are adults and I am no longer in the classroom, I continue to support this love of reading by sharing my stories about Messy Marvyn and his circle of sweet friends.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

The friends that you choose are important. Open your heart to friends that love, support, and lift you up. Look past race and gender, and focus on your friends' hearts. Celebrate your friends' unique qualities while embracing and loving your own individuality.





Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?





This is my very first book! I've always wanted to write a children's book. I knew that the idea would come to me one day. When I would read bedtime stories to my children, I thought that I could do this!


Q: Tell us something more about your books?




Federico Exaggerated is Hazel Pacheco's second picture book in the Henry and Friends series.



Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? is there any specific reason?


I thought that my children enjoyed the story so much, maybe other children would too. And I'd like to encourage family reading.


A Saturday Morning Surprise



freshened up and went outside where a **Helicopter** took me to the set of Wake Up Bangalore! There, some women came and rushed me off to get ready. Then, I was asked to sit down on a couch

next to the **famous** anchor, author and talk show host, Diane Ischyros! She asked me a lot of questions about my writing while being recorded. 




