Dear Readers,

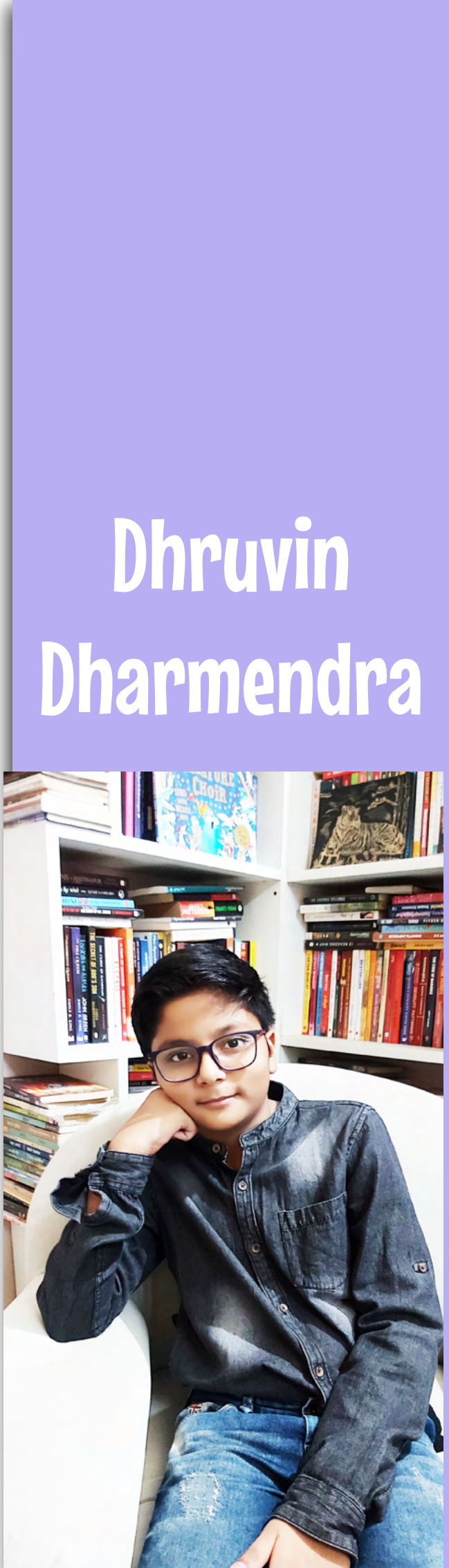

Thank you for being a loyal reader of our magazine. I wish you a wonderful new year and a happy winter!

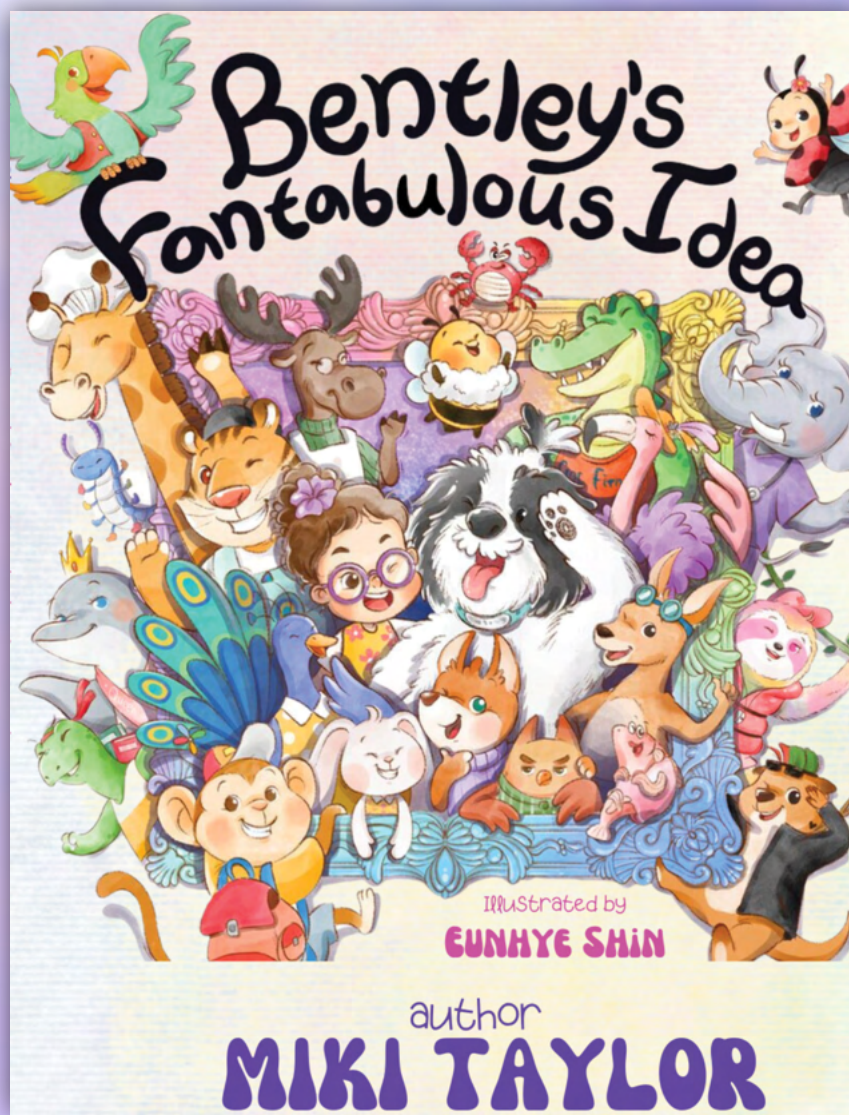

I love to color (yes I still color in children's coloring books and gift them every Christmas to my daughter's and now granddaughter and I love when Crayola comes out with a new type of crayon such as glitter crayons) so there will be at least 1 coloring page in every book, and each book will have hidden items to find throughout the pages. Two of the items are very near and dear to me because they are about my late Mammalw. You will have to purchase a book to find out more. Let's just say it will keep the kids intrigued and it will easily become their new favorite book.

I created a coloring storybook that I mentioned is available for purchase on my website. That is really special to me because it allows kids (and adults) to use their creativity and color the book as they wish it would have been colored. The words and special pages of the book are in color, but the remainder of the book is filled with coloring pages. It is really special and something I will be creating for all of my books. It is uniquely fantastic.

Q: Why do you choose kids as your reader? Is there any specific reason?

I'm easily a kid at heart and I now have a granddaughter that just turned 3 so I wanted books that my entire family could love. I also have the cutest sheepdoodle that is superduperfabulisticXBdogolicious and makes the absolute cutest main character. My love of color and imagination also played a part in why I wanted to write children's books. Fun delightful, colorful books and a website that keeps kids engaged creating a fun world for them to enjoy was just a natural topic. I would love to venture into short chapter books at some point with Bentley's bestest not-furry human friend Betty and her new bestest human friend, PeteyJack, that will be introduced in book number two. I do have a novel loosely based on my life that I want to write at some point, but to write it you must relive it and I'm not quite there yet.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

I had thought about writing a children's book when my daughter's, were young and my youngest daughter played with cotton balls and called them puppies, I thought there was a story there, but that was just a thought, the opportunity never presented itself and I never acted on that desire. I never revisited the idea of writing a children's book until Bentley came into my life. When I was house training him, we would go outside and there was a big bumble bee that would always come around and one time it even landed on his head.

Bentley jumped around and tried to play with it, so I thought "The adventures of Bentley & The Bee" was a great book series. I dabbled a bit, wrote down some ideas, and last fall I knew it was time. I knew I wanted Bentley to be the main character and I had to include Mr. Bee but I also wanted to honor my Mammalw (who passed away during the pandemic) whose name was Betty and knew my relationship with Bentley was a great foundation for a book series so The Adventures of Bentley, Betty, & Mr. Bee was born.

The Crew, I chose the animals, wrote up their personalities and then sent the list to my illustrator and contracted her to create them. I wanted to show a lot of diversity within their names, likes, what they thought they wanted to be and based some of the characters off of some of my family members. For example, my mom collects rabbits, so I knew I wanted to include a rabbit. My mom's name is Delores (Dee for short) so DeeDee was easily the name I chose for the dolphin. We use to live in Maryland and love crabs so I included a crab name CiCi. I love to bake so knew I wanted someone to be a baker. Eloise Elephant and Molly Moose are based off of my youngest daughter and KaiKai Kangaroo is based off of her husband. I pulled a lot from things I love and similarities to family and people I enjoy watching.

I am in the process of tweaking the bios for the new characters that I will be introducing in my second book. The new characters include a bestest not-furry human friend for Betty named PeteyJack, named after my great uncles that I had really memorable relationships with. Betty & PeteyJack bond over their love of always wearing mismatched socks!!

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

Yes, Yes. I hope that you all love reading Bentley's Fantabulous Idea as much as I enjoyed writing it. It is a very special book with some heartfelt sentimental meaning and I hope that each and every one of you can take a moment and reminisce when you find the cardinal. Q: Tell us something more about your books?

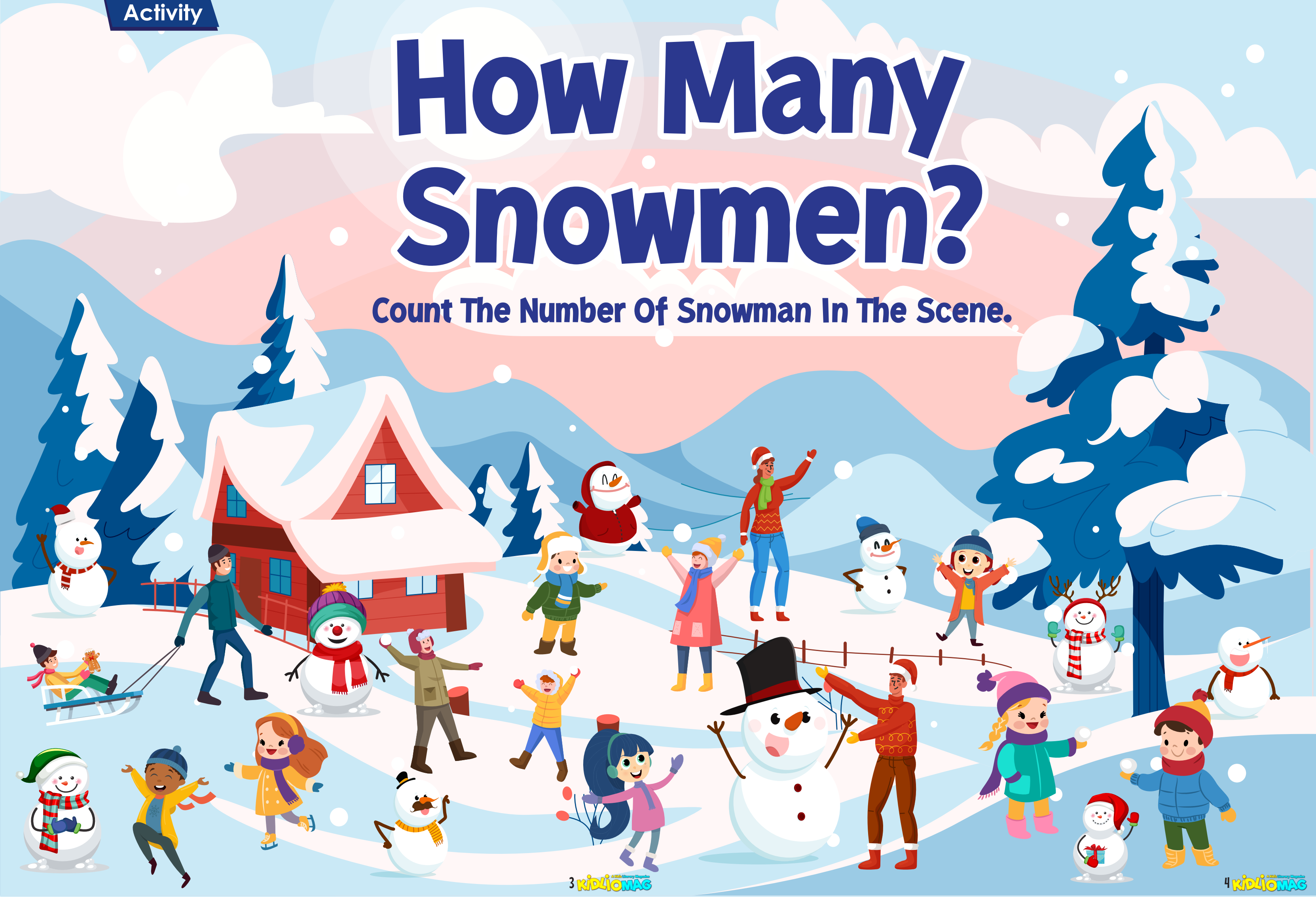

Q: First, tell us something about yourself.

I love to sing, but unfortunately, I can't. It's actually quite sad. I attempted to sing in my podcast intro, and the sound engineer strongly advised that I should consider getting a vocal artist.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

Officially, my journey began five years ago. I started taking notes on my iPad at work, but I sat on many of my book ideas for years. Two years ago, there was an update to my workspace system that wiped out all of my drafts, and that served as a wake-up call. I began to back up my work and then started planning my next moves for my writing career. And now, Rella B is here!

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

I've had a love for writing since I was a kid. English was my favorite class. I actually wrote and illustrated my first book in 3rd grade, which was an autobiography. Hopefully, I will be releasing a more extensive addition in the coming years.

Q: Tell us something more about your books.

Most of my books are part of a series. They cover topics that I hope will inspire conversations within the families that read them. It's not always common to talk about money or economic and social differences with children, but my books provide a great starting point for potential dialogues.

I also aim to have each book accompanied by a workbook of some kind so I can provide as much value as possible.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

I have a day job that affords me a lot of free time. So, I would journal and jot down ideas that came to my mind. Often, inspiration strikes during conversations I'm having. I usually base the characters on people I know in real life. For example, for "Mama, I Got a Dollar," I was discussing with someone how they never really learned anything about money until they had a job. And for "If Shapes Could Talk," I had a conversation with a previous social worker that reminded me of the diverse backgrounds and upbringings that all children have.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

Absolutely! I want readers to know that you can enjoy doing things even if you're not "the best" at them. This is something I struggled with a lot as a child. If I wasn't the fastest or the best at something, I would lose interest and focus on what I was good at. Now that I'm an adult, I love trying new things and slowly improving to reach my personal best, not anyone else's.

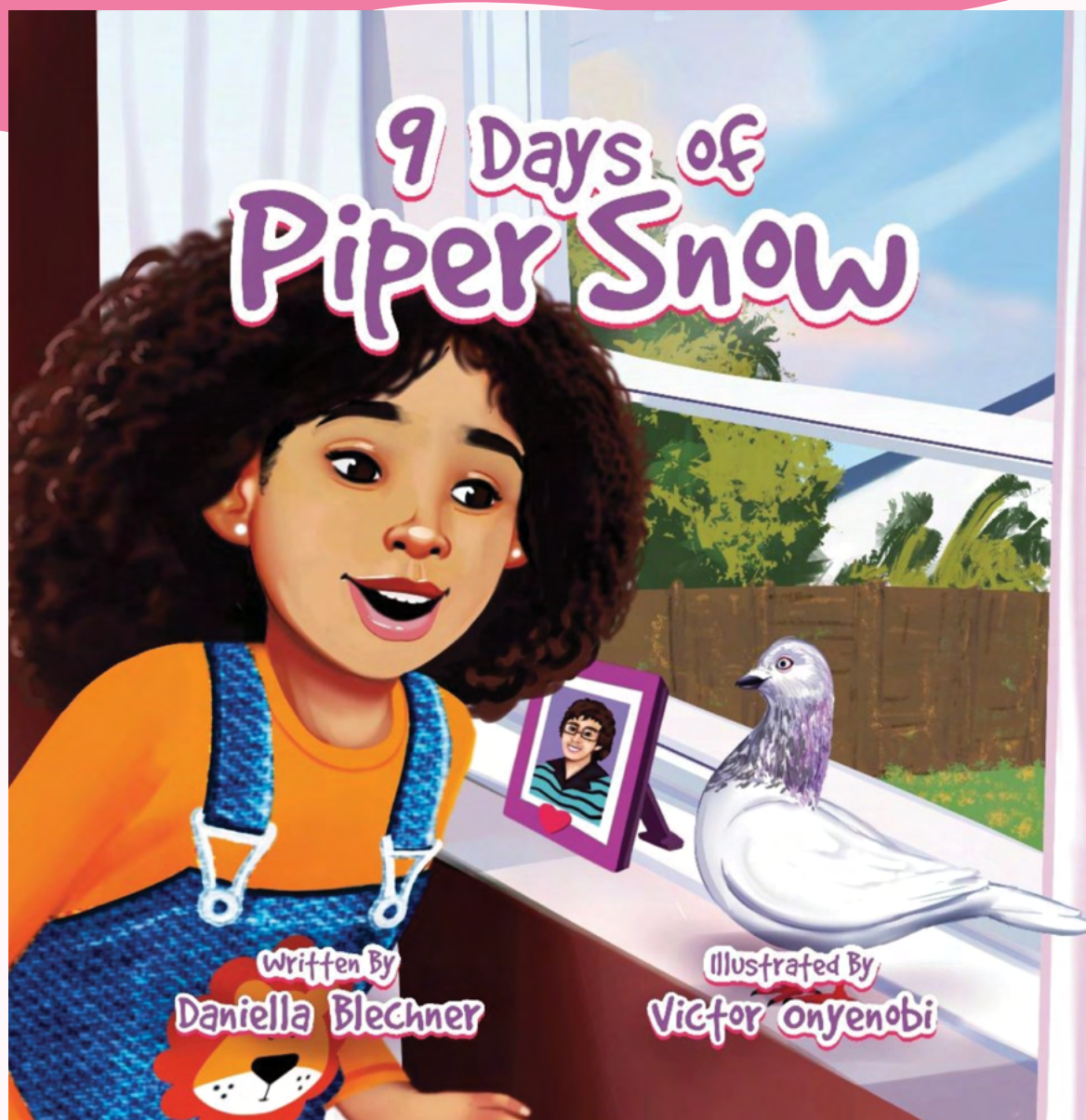

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

Unexpected things can happen that put us on the road to creating our dreams. From a very young age I've always wanted to be a children's author. It's been a childhood dream. I've helped over 200 authors write and publish their own books and written eight nonfiction books for adults, but I still hadn't fulfilled my dream of writing a children's book.

My father, Ron Blechner, passed away in Oct 2020. In March 2023 I moved house and a few months after moving in, I unpacked my late father's photos and memory box and put a photo on the windowsill. I popped downstairs and ten minutes later, a beautiful white pigeon was standing inside the house on the windowsill!

Low and behold this white pigeon would be the start of my career as a children's book author and the inspiration behind my first children's book, '9 Days of Piper Snow'.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I've always wanted to be a writer. I used to glue together bits of paper to create my own books and write imaginative stories and draw pictures. I used to tell stories to my sisters too. It's always been a passion of mine.

My first book I penned was a children's fantasy novel 'the Adventures of Sadie Thompson'. I thought I'd completed it in 2011 and that it would be the first book I'd publish. However, I ended up publishing eight nonfiction books from personal development to comedy and poetry, but my heart has always been in writing for children.

Q: What inspired you to write '9 Days of Piper Snow'?

Well, the pigeon I mentioned at the beginning began to visit me daily. It was summertime so I would have the windows open, and he would literally just walk right in and make himself at home. Even if I opened it just a crack, the pigeon would somehow find a way in by squeezing himself through. I started posting about him on social media and he started getting a lot of attention so much so, I set up an Instagram account @pipersnowhepigeon for him and he started getting a following. I admired his steely determination to get into the house.

I started researching what white pigeons symbolise and what I found but was pretty special. White pigeons symbolise messages from loved ones who have passed away and are also a symbol to follow your own dreams and put your own passions first. For years I'd helped so many people publish children's books but had never fulfilled that dream myself.

One day I was in my office at home and the pigeon, who I've since named Piper, was just staring at me through the window and the inspiration just came.

Q: Tell us about '9 Days of Piper Snow'. What is it about and what is the message?

This book is about a young girl called Samara. It's the anniversary of her dad's passing and she's missing him dearly. Out of the blue, a white pigeon, whom she names Piper Snow, appears and the two form a beautiful bond and a friendship begins. Slowly Samara begins to find joy in life again as her feathered friend brings her much needed joy and laughter. But then she discovers Piper has another life and has to learn to let go. This beautiful book is full of magic, adventure and explores themes such as loss, grief, friendship and the importance of cherishing memories. If we have great memories of people we love, then is anything ever truly gone?

Q: What makes your book different from most children's books?

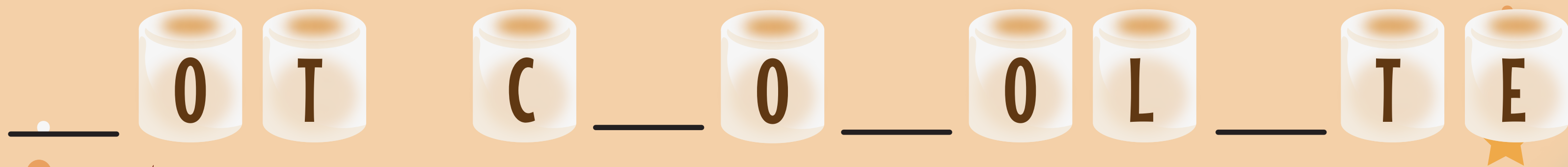
My book is different to most children's books because it is based on a real white pigeon, who at first was determined to fight his way into my home but who now has ended up becoming my faithful companion and source of inspiration. I believe Piper was sent to me as a messenger from my dad to remind me to fulfil my own dream of becoming children's author and helping other children move through their grief, especially those who have lost a parent or a sibling.

Q: Tell us something more about your books?

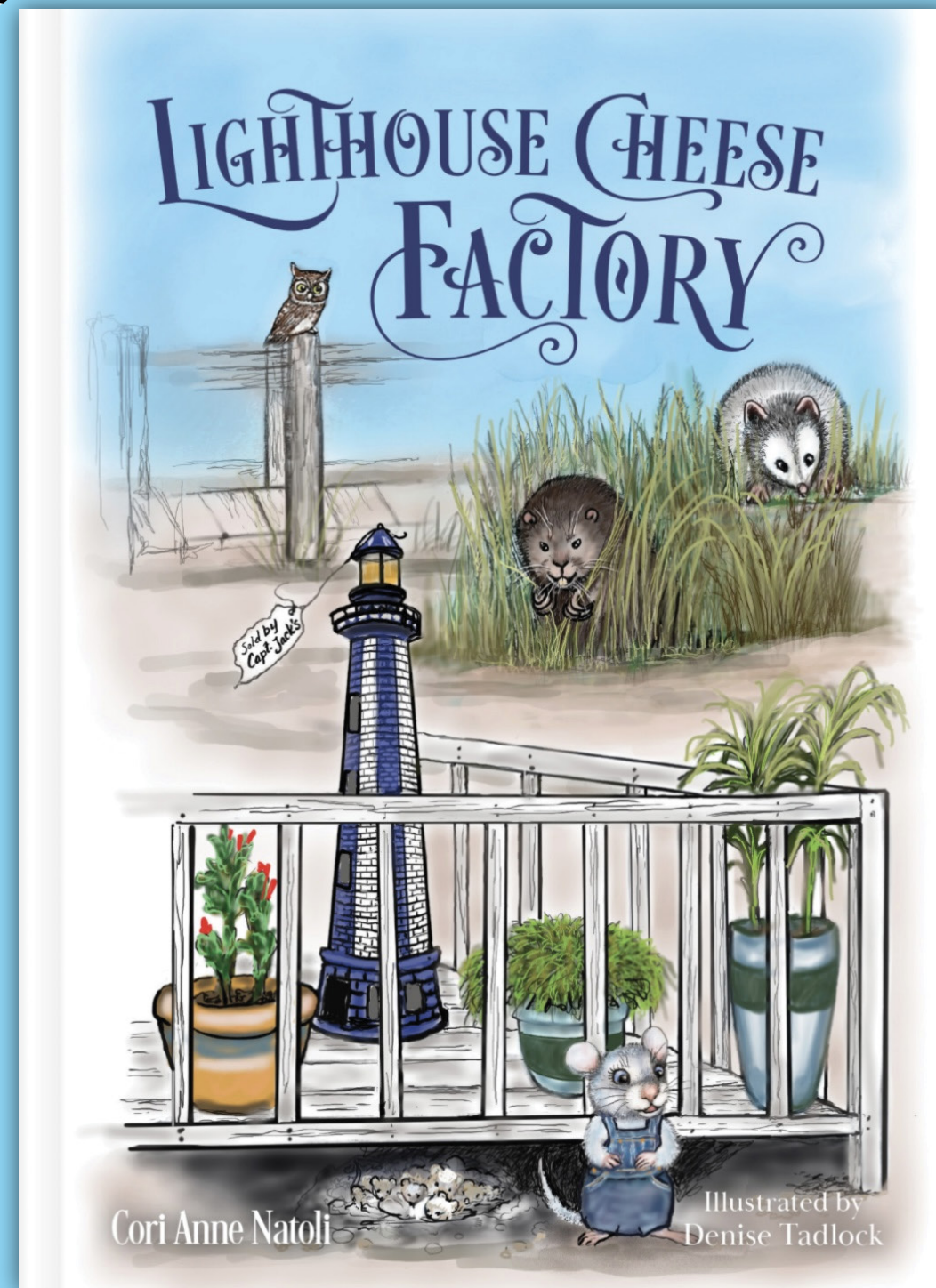

Don't be afraid to take chances. Realizing your dream may require a little help from your friends. The best part - together you'll learn how extraordinary you are as individuals and as one powerful team!

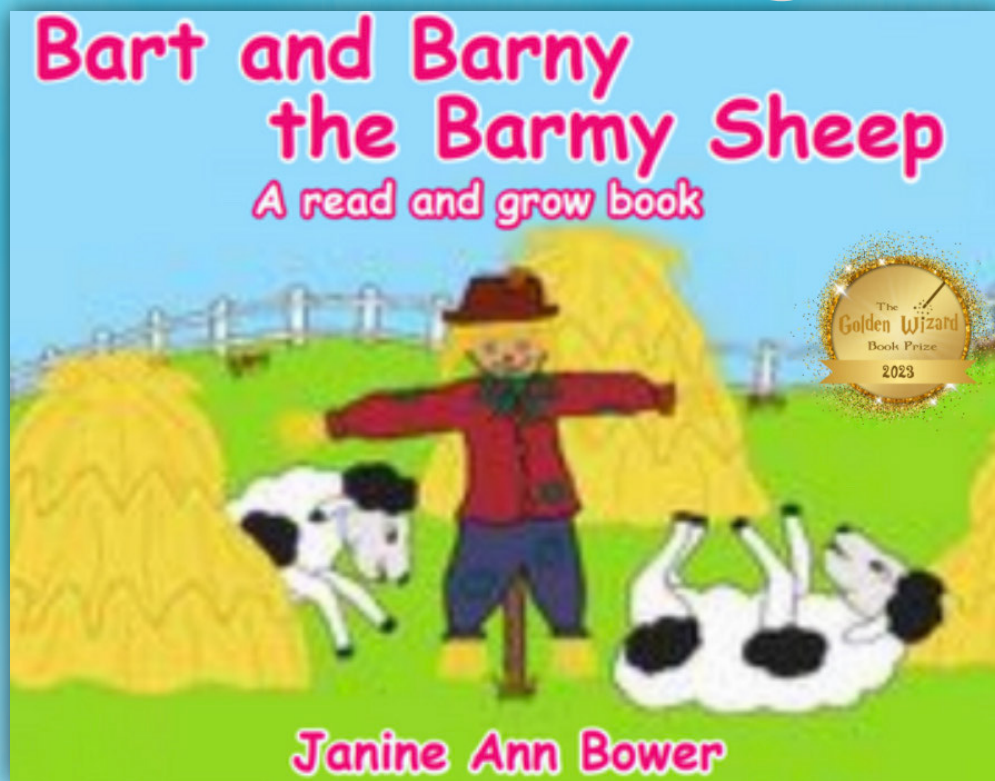

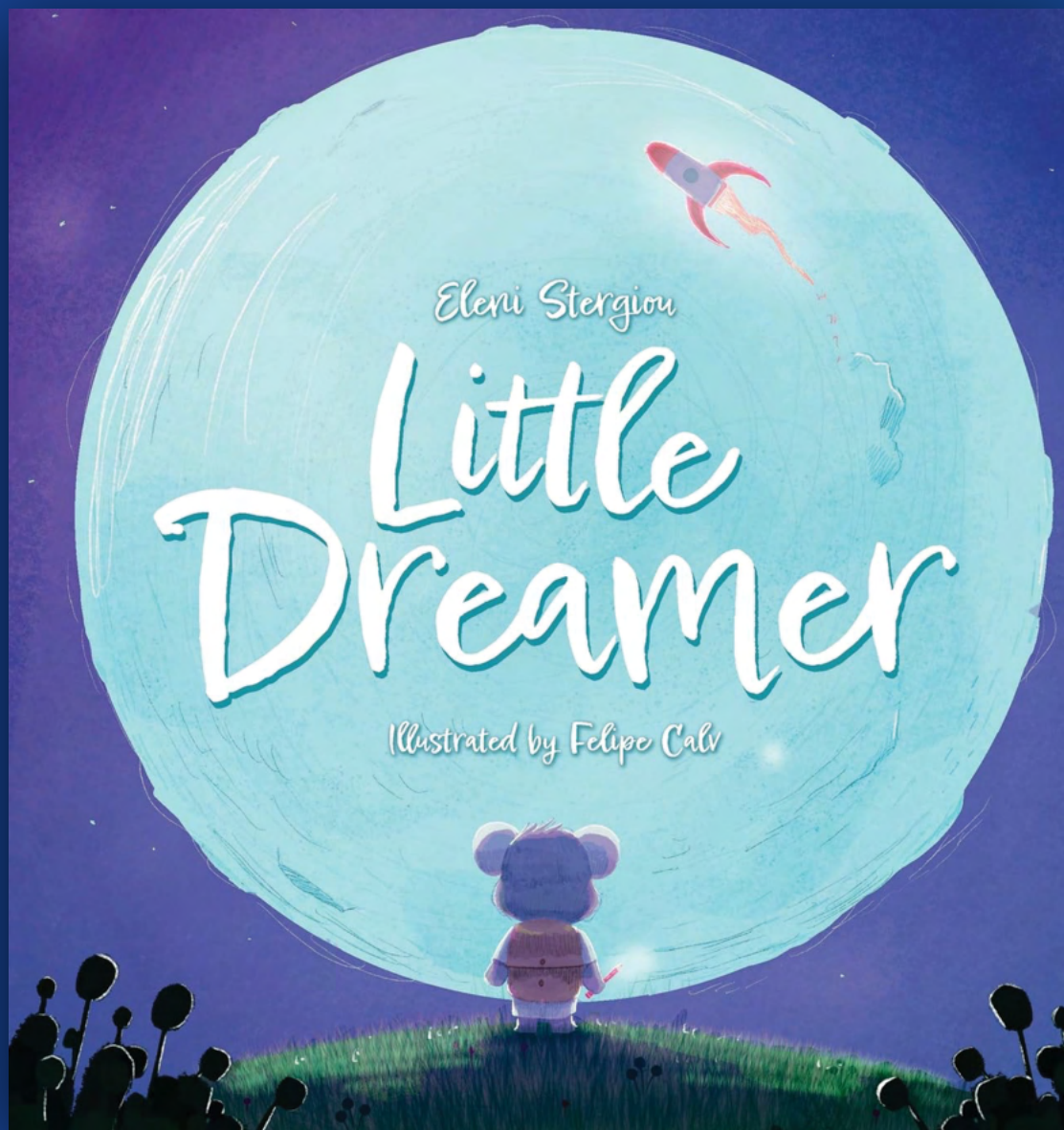

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

I started writing "Little Dreamer" when I was 9 and finished it during the summer holidays. It will be published on 24 November.

Q: Tell us something more about your book?

My book is about a little koala named Koko, whose small size seems to hold her back from achieving her dream of going to space.

She doesn't quite fit in at school and her classmates can be quite unkind, making her doubt herself even more. "Little Dreamer" is a story about discovering the power of self-belief and not letting anything hold you back. Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

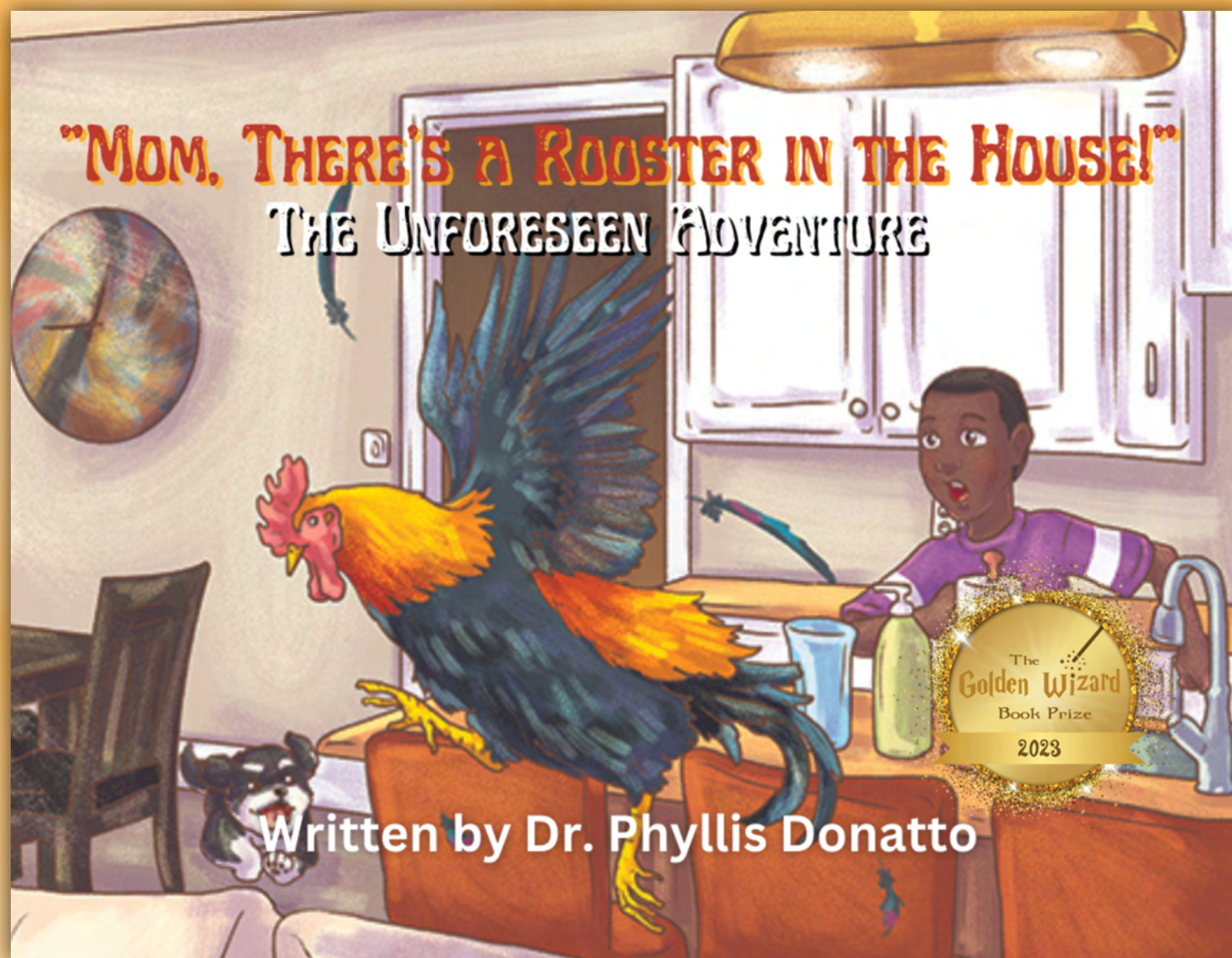

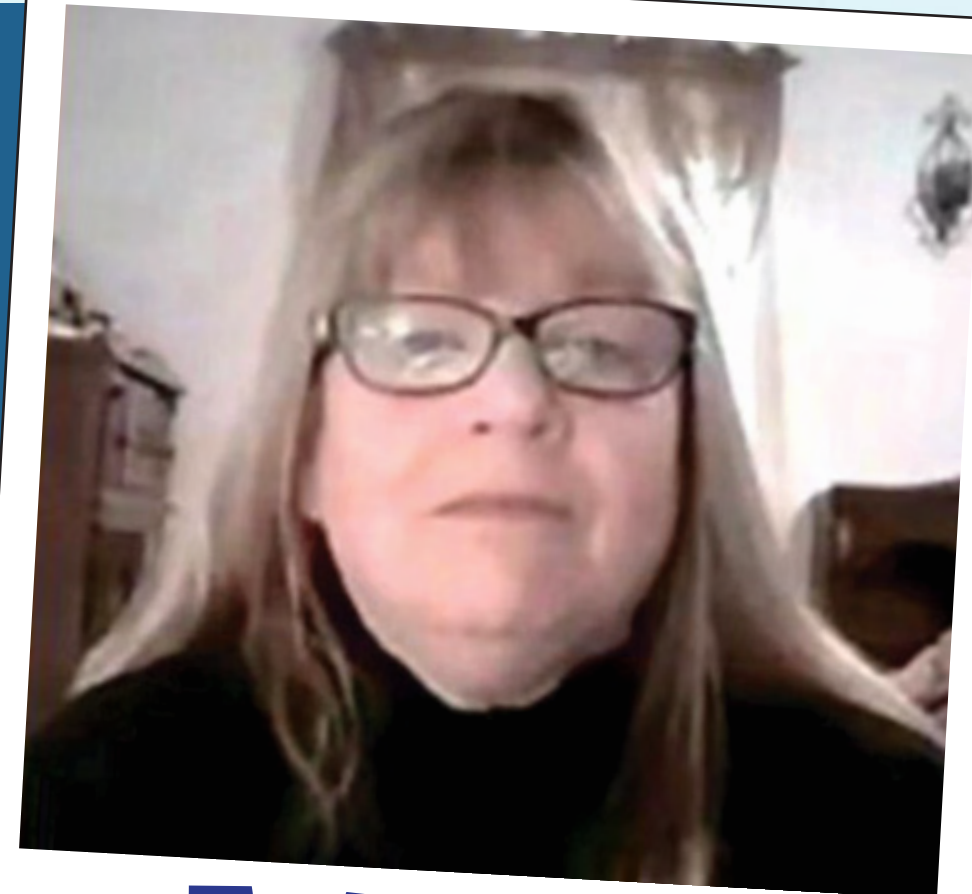

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?
