Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

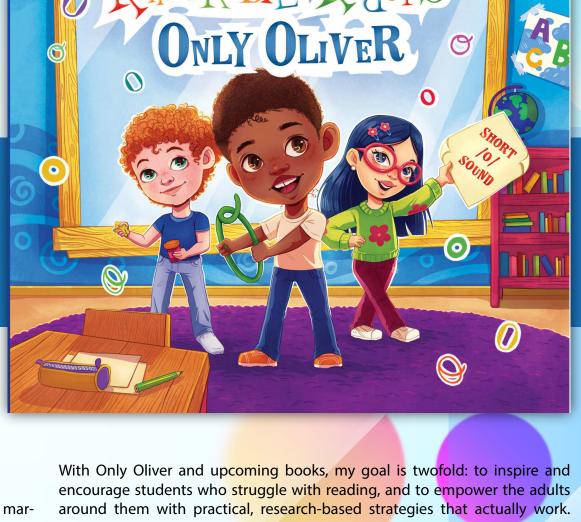
I think it might have been when I was younger. I started writing in a journal about day to day things, then I wrote about my kids and their adventures, birthdays and vacations.

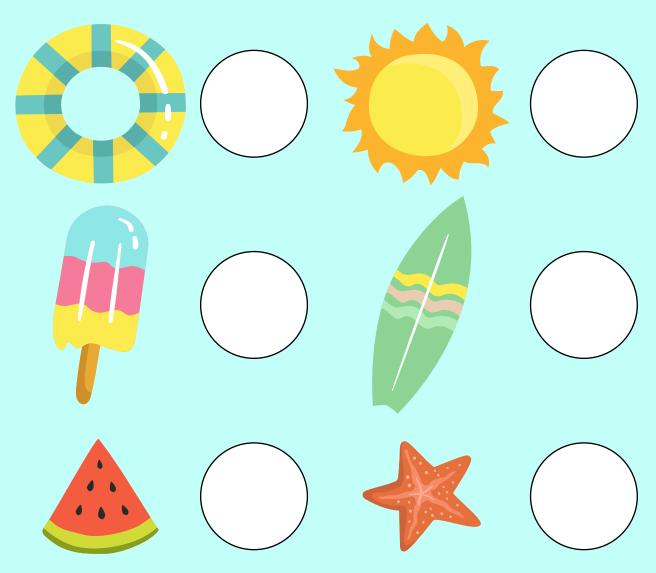
Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

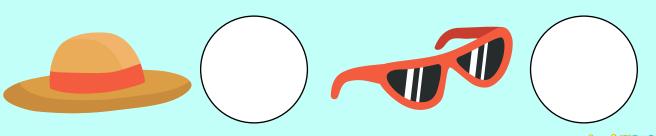

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

I am a board-certified pediatrician, wife, mom, and children's book author who loves helping kids grow happy and healthy. Inspired by my patients, and my curious toddler, I wrote "Zoe's Day with Dr. J" to make doctor visits fun and less scary. When I'm not caring for little ones, I'm reading, traveling, or playing make-believe with my daughter!

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My journey as a writer began while balancing life as a pediatrician and a new mom. I often saw how anxious young children felt about visiting the doctor, and I wanted to create something that could help ease their fears. After having my daughter and reading to her every day, my love for children's literature was reignited.

During maternity leave, I felt a spark of inspiration and began writing my first book. I started the manuscript in those quiet, fleeting moments between diaper changes and nap times. Although it took some time to find the perfect illustrator, everything fell into place once I connected with Bonnie Bright. Her vibrant, heartwarming style brought my vision to life.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

For fun, I used to write stories and poems as a little girl, but this is my first time stepping into the world of publishing and it's been such a rewarding journey.

Q: Tell us something more about your books.

Zoe's Day with Dr. J is a fun and reassuring story that follows a little girl named Zoe as she goes for her well-child visit with her pediatrician. As both a pediatrician and a mom, I wanted to create a book that helps reduce the anxiety many young children feel about going to the doctor. Through colorful illustrations and gentle storytelling, kids get to see what to expect during a checkup in a way that feels safe and familiar.

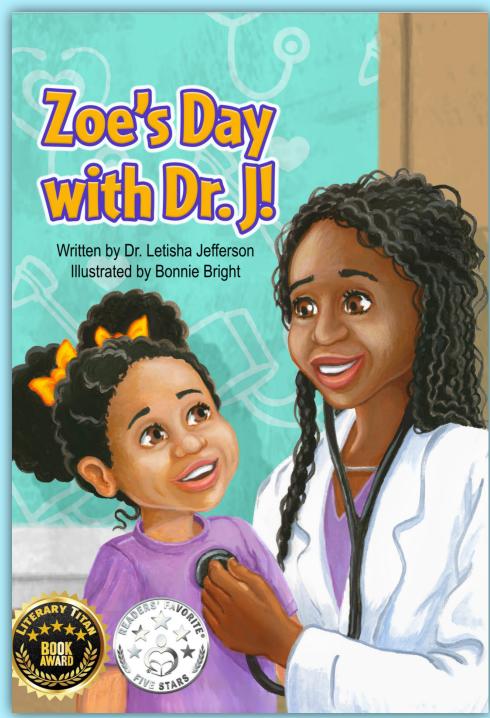
There's also a companion activity and coloring book that encourages creativity and learning through play. Both books are designed to support early childhood literacy while helping families turn everyday experiences, like a trip to the doctor, into something positive and empowering.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

The inspiration for the story and characters came directly from my everyday life as a pediatrician and a mom. I've met so many young children who felt nervous about visiting the doctor, and I wanted to create something that could make that experience less scary and more relatable.

When I had my daughter and started reading to her daily, it reignited my love for children's books. That's when the idea of Zoe came to life, a curious, brave little girl who reflects the many children I've cared for over the years. Dr. J is, of course, inspired by my own role as a pediatrician, and the nurse character is based on real nurses I've worked with who bring kindness and comfort to every visit. These characters felt like a natural extension of my world, and I wanted them to feel familiar and comforting to young readers too.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

The message I want to leave for my readers, especially the little ones, is that going to the doctor doesn't have to be scary. It can be a safe, caring, and even fun experience. Through Zoe's Day with Dr. J, I hope children feel seen, heard, and empowered to ask questions and be curious about their health.

For parents and caregivers, I want this book to be a tool for starting conversations, easing fears, and creating positive memories around wellness visits. I also hope it encourages families to read together and make literacy a joyful part of everyday life. Supporting early literacy is a cause close to my heart, and I believe that books can open doors, not just to learning, but to confidence, connection, and lifelong curiosity.

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

Her books, 'I Want to Be an Astronaut' and 'The Path to Friendship', celebrate adventure, discovery, and the importance of friendship, inspiring children to dream big and explore the wonders around them.

Both titles have rightfully earned the prestigious Golden Wizard Book Prize.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

The first story I remember writing was a mystery book with the main character based on the type of girl I wished I was at that time: confident, adventurous, quirky. I was only a young teenager so it wasn't published; I do however remember sharing it with a pen pal I had who lived in America and being overjoyed when she said she found the characters relatable and enjoyed the story. Success!

Q: Tell us something more about your books.

I had initially aimed to only publish one book, but I loved both of these and couldn't decide between them.

The Path to Friendship is, at its simplest, a tale of friendship focused on a young boy and his dog making a new friend. It addresses issues such as not judging a book by its cover, considering the impact of your actions and reminds us all to lead with kindness.

I Want to be an Astronaut follows two brothers on a whistle-stop tour of our solar system, teaching children the names and order of the planets and introducing the concept that there is more in space than is traditionally taught at this young age.

Through both books, I really enjoyed taking these complex ideas like difficult social interactions and space science and making them understandable to young children.

Oh and both books also have some really cool activity pages at the end to carry on the fun once the story has ended!

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

The boys in I Want to be an Astronaut are based on my children. They are obsessed with space! That book really is a tribute to them, their shared passion and also as a reminder to never stop being curious.

For The Path to Friendship, I was visiting a relative with my youngest son one day. I watched the joy emanate from him as he developed a beautiful friendship with their dog. The story practically fell out of my brain as I imagined the wonderful adventures they could have together. I wrote that one very quickly and can honestly say the text barely changed from that initial moment right up to the final published version!

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

Just to reiterate the themes of the books: Never stop being curious and lead with kindness - always.

Q: Tell us something more about your books.

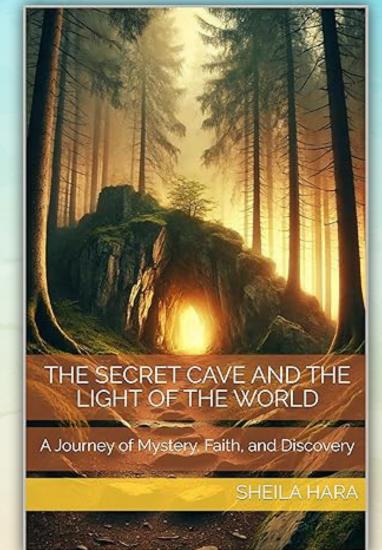

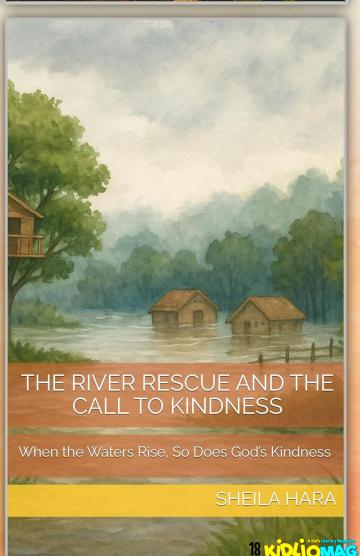
Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

You are created on purpose, with purpose, and for a purpose. Don't be afraid to be different, kind, or bold. God made you just the way you are—and that's a beautiful thing.

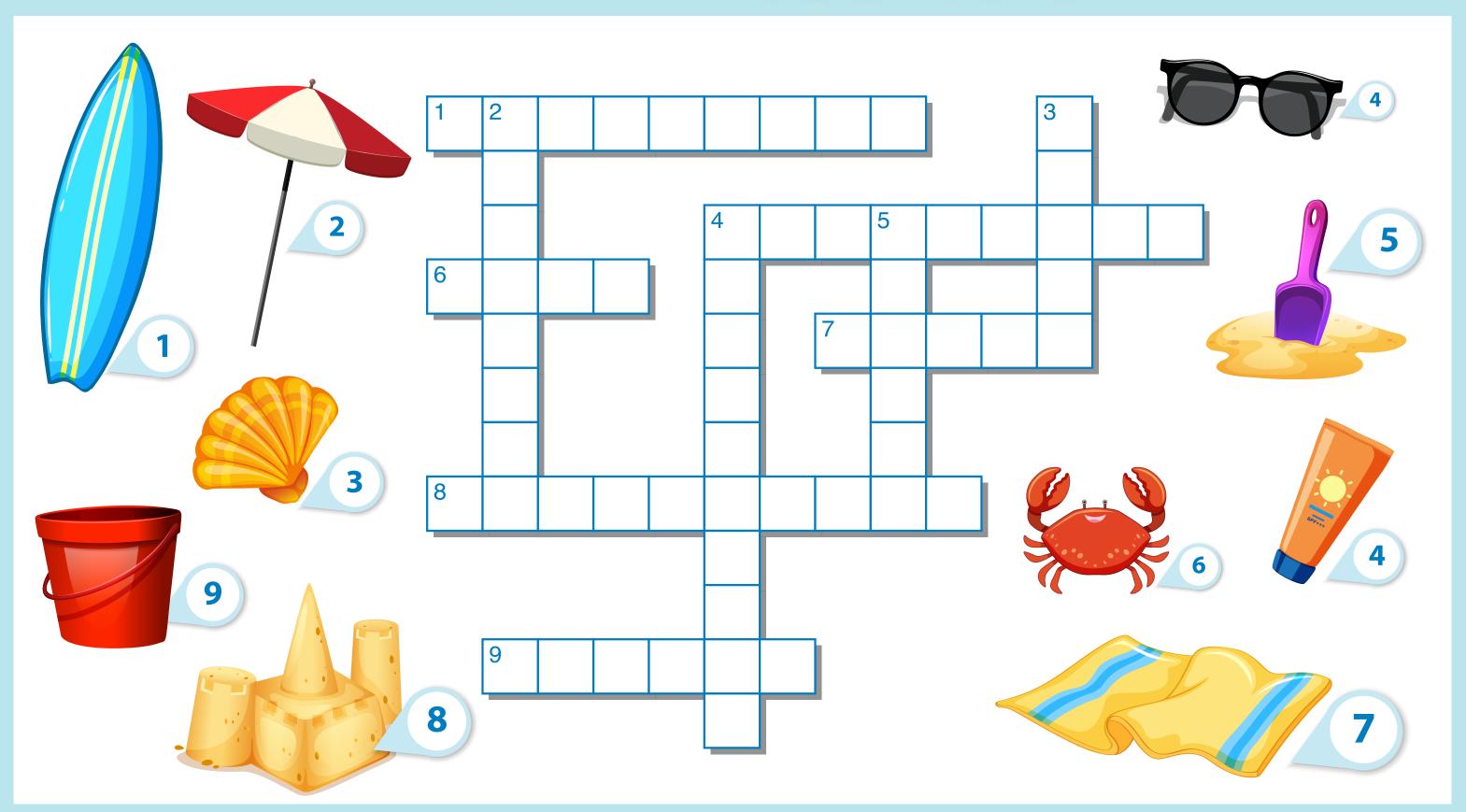

HANNAH'S **CALL TO CARE** How One Girl Discovered the Power of Protecting Wildlfe CLAUDIA CLARK

HANNAHS CALL TO CARE

How One Girl Discovered The **Power Of Protecting Wildlife**

Through a series of scenarios, 12-year-old Hannah educates children and adults about the most significant threats facing Australia's native animals and the simple things people can do to help protect them from many of these dangers.



Q: First tell us something about yourself.

I was born and raised in Michigan, but after my husband and I married in 1995 we relocated to the San Francisco Bay Area where we lived until we moved to Berlin in 2017. We made that drastic move because we wanted to travel and experience a slower life pace than the Silicon Valley provided.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

with koalas when I saw my first photo of one as a young girl. When I was 10, I wrote my first short story about a mother koala and her joey. I was honored that the school administration selected my story to represent the school at a local young writers' conference, where I met other local students and authors. Sadly, I lost the story, and other than the names of the two koalas (Kristi and Kandi), I do not remember anything about it.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

The above-mentioned story about the koalas was my first story. No, it was never officially published. Over the years, my interests and talents have evolved, and up until recently, all my work has been nonfiction for an adult audience, as indicated by my first published book, Dear Barack: The Extraordinary Partnership of Barack Obama and Angela Merkel (published in 2021),



Q: Tell us something more about your books.

As well as being an avid animal lover, I am an advocate for social justice and progressive causes. My goal is to write nonfiction books that educate, inspire, and entertain people while engaging in activities to make the world a safer and more just place.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

I am primarily an author for adults, and I was conducting research for my upcoming book, As a child, I had a gift for creative writing, and my first dream was to be a writer. I fell in love Guardians Down Under: The Unsung Heroes Saving Australia's Vanishing Wildlife and based on the information people gave me, it became clear that to make a difference in protecting the wildlife we needed to educated the children about the wonderful animals and the threats they face. I took some of the most common complaints wildlife rescuers had about the repeated dangers facing wildlife, where I thought children could easily make a difference and help save these animals. Instead of writing in traditional chapters, I used "scenarios" to discuss the threat, why people should care, what they can do to prevent these dangers, and what to do if they encounter an animal in these circumstances.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

You do not have to commit your life or be an expert to have an impact, and small actions can make a big impact.

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

I was born and raised in Australia, but I now live in Hawaii with my husband and our golden retriever, Apollo—who also happens to be one of the stars of Maddy & Apollo's Magical Garden Adventures! I'm a nutritionist, entrepreneur, and wellness advocate, and when I'm not writing or working, you can usually find me outdoors—freediving with sharks (yes, really!), going for a hike, or chasing new adventures around the world.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My journey as a writer really began when I was a kid—I was that book-loving child who would binge-read in every spare moment. I always dreamed of becoming a writer, and even took creative writing classes in high school just for fun. Life took me in a different direction though—I went to law school and spent over a decade in the legal field. But after pivoting into the health and wellness industry, I finally felt ready to create something that combined my love of storytelling with my passion for health. Seven years into that new path, Maddy & Apollo's Magical Garden Adventures was born.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

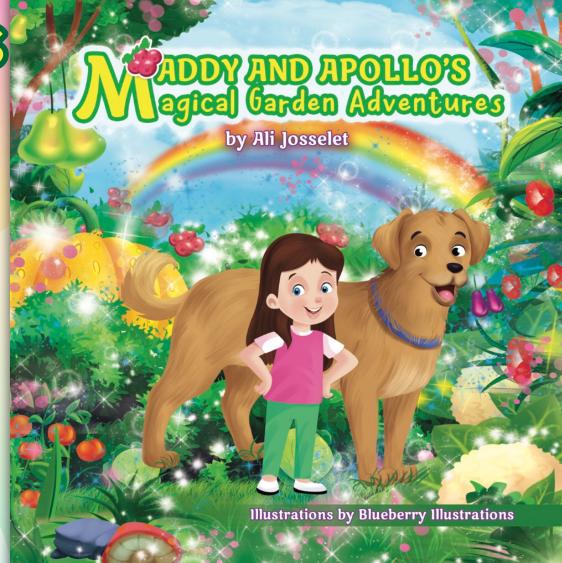
I wrote my first real story when I was about 12 or 13, as part of a creative writing class I was taking outside of school. It was the first time I remember feeling completely immersed in building characters and a world of my own. That story definitely isn't published (and probably never will be—haha!), but it holds a special place in my heart.

Q: Tell us something more about your books.

I'm so excited to say "books" now—because the next two in the Maddy & Apollo series are releasing very soon! Each story gently inspires kids to embrace everyday wellness through magical, joy-filled adventures. From eating healthy to being kind and solving problems together, the stories blend health with creativity, curiosity, and connection.

Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

The characters, Maddy & Apollo, are inspired by my beautiful niece, Maddy, and my beloved golden retriever, Apollo. Their sass, curiosity, and goofy charm made them the perfect duo for a magical wellness adventure that kids could connect with.



And as for the stories—they were born from my passion for health and wellness. As a nutritionist and founder of a nonprofit focused on cancer prevention, I've seen firsthand how powerful early habits can be. My husband, a fighter pilot in the U.S. Air Force, is at high risk for certain cancers due to his work—and that personal connection pushed me to act. Up to 50% of cancers are preventable through diet and lifestyle, yet only about 4% of people eat enough fruits and veggies for good health—and kids are often left out of the wellness conversation.

That's what sparked Maddy & Apollo's Magical Garden Adventures—I wanted to create a story that makes healthy habits feel fun, joyful, and a little bit magical. Because when wellness is presented as fun, joyful, and part of everyday life, it becomes something kids can grow up embracing, rather than resisting. And the best part—100% of the proceeds go to kids fighting cancer, which makes this project even more meaningful to me.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

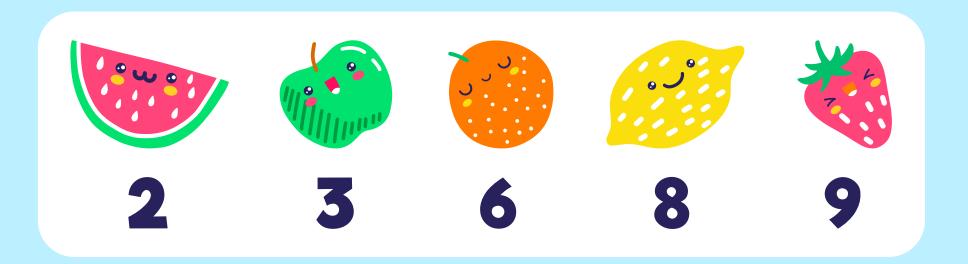
My message is simple: wellness can be magical. I hope these stories remind kids (and even adults!) that healthy habits start small, grow over time, and can be full of creativity, connection, and fun. My dream is for kids to grow up with wellness as the norm—not the exception—and to know that their choices, even the little ones, really have the power to shape a healthier, happier world.

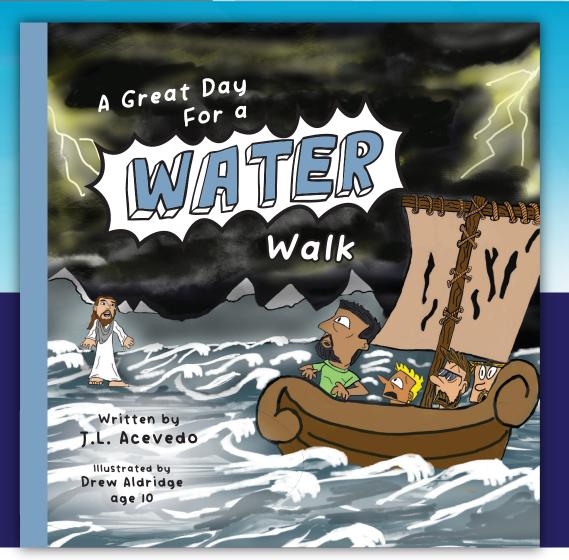

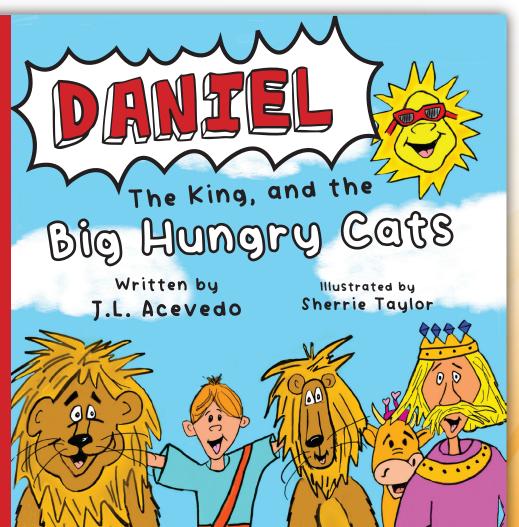

Through our stories, we aim to share the love of Jesus in a way that sparks the imagination, enriches young minds, and makes the timeless truths of God's Word accessible to even the youngest readers, helping them grow in faith and understanding.



Q: First tell us something about yourself.

My name is Jorge Acevedo. I have been the pastor of Lake Washington Fellowship for the last 37 years. I have a wonderful wife, two amazing daughters, three grandkids (12, 8, and 3 years old), three dogs, and a guinea pig. I love to laugh and spend time with my family. I also love sports, going places, and watching tv with my wife.

Q: When did you write your first story? Is it published or not?

I became a published author through Amazon when I wrote a non-fiction book eight years ago entitled Hecklers In Your Crowd: Silencing The Voices That Hold You Back. Last year I began writing again, but this time reimagined bible stories for toddlers. I've taken bible stories and reimagined them using rhyme, repetition, and some silliness. The first one of these PanShu reimagined stories for toddlers became live in Amazing last year in October of 2025. The stories are hand drawn with vivid colors and silly looking characters. They are creative and can make both the parent and the child laugh. Also, the books do keep the young children's attention.





Q: How did these stories and characters come to your mind?

Because the bible is full of great stories, I have written close to forty of these reimagined stories. Each book has a message. For example, in the book, Jonah and the Stinky Whale, the message is that God can help you even when you find yourself in the belly of a fish. In the story of Daniel, the King, and the Big Hungry Cats, the message is that God's angels are watching over your life. And in the story The Day David Met One Mean Giant, the message is that God will be there to help you fight your battles. Each book has interactive pages in the end where a child can draw their favorite story characters.

One more thought, I want parents to get back to telling their children bible based stories from the time they are very young. We have a generation of children coming up that have never heard of God. PanShu reimagined bible stories will help remind parents and children that there's hope in God.
