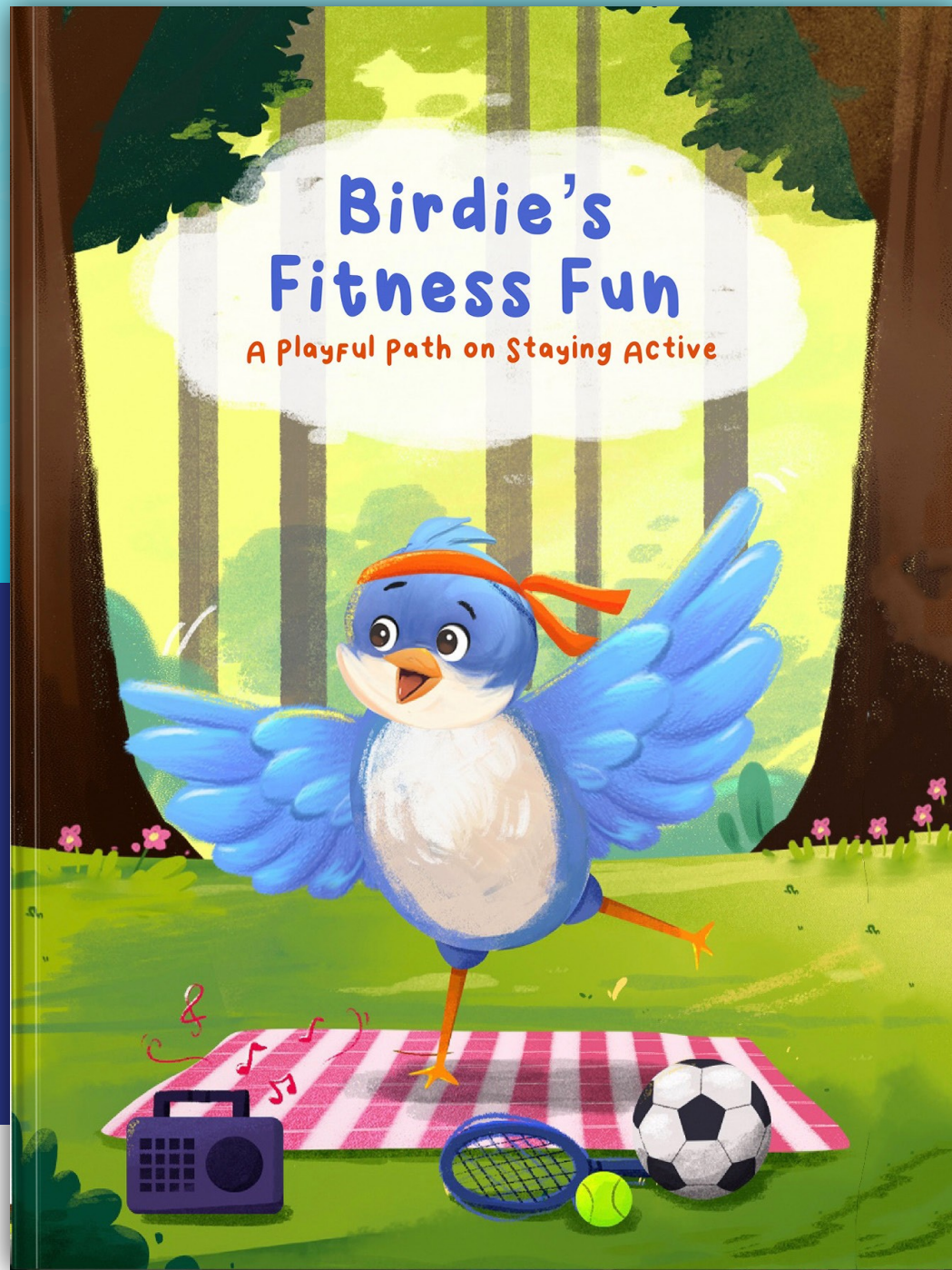


Birdie's Fitness Fun

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

I'm a children's book author, Registered Sanitarian and Dietitian, and former health inspector with over 30 years of experience in food safety and nutrition. My passion has always been helping families and children learn healthy habits in a fun, engaging way. I'm also a certified yoga and barre teacher, and I love incorporating movement, wellness, and positivity into everything I create. My children's book series was inspired by my desire to make learning about food safety, nutrition, and healthy lifestyles exciting and accessible for young readers.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My journey as a writer began when I had a milestone birthday coming up. I had made a list of 50 things I wanted to complete before turning 50 and being a published author was on top of that list. As a health inspector, I saw firsthand how important it was to teach children about food safety early in life. I realized there weren't any fun, kid-friendly books on the topic, so I decided to create one myself. That idea turned into my first book, and from there the Birdie series was born. Writing became a meaningful way for me to combine my professional background with my love for storytelling and education.

Q: Tell us something more about your book series.

The Birdie series follows a lovable bluebird named Birdie, named after my daughter, and her friends as they explore important topics like food safety, nutrition, cooking, and staying active. Each book combines rhyming text, colorful characters, and educational lessons in a way that's fun and easy for children to understand.

My goal is to help kids build healthy habits early while also encouraging confidence, curiosity, and trying new things. The books also include interactive elements and messages that families and teachers can continue beyond the story. My favorite part of the series is going into schools and teaching children these lessons in a fun way and now creating curriculum for teachers to incorporate with the books inside their own classrooms.

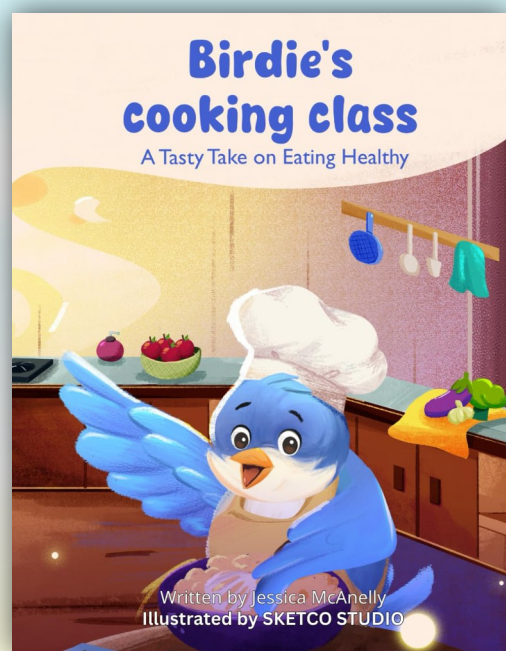
Q: How did you create the magical system in your books and characters?

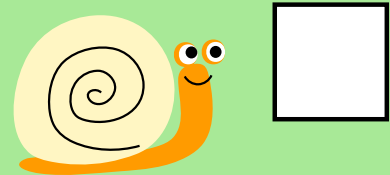
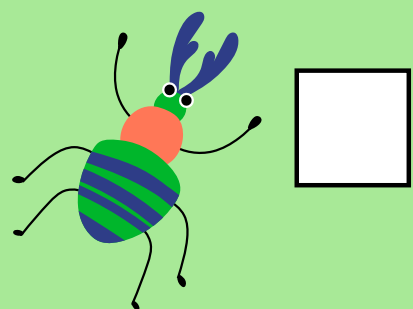
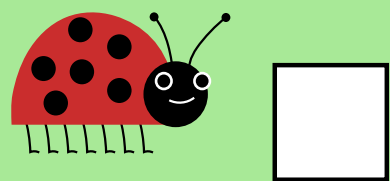
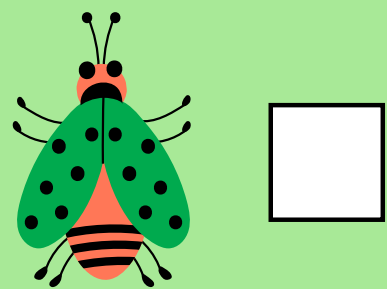
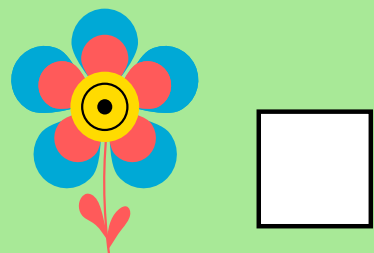
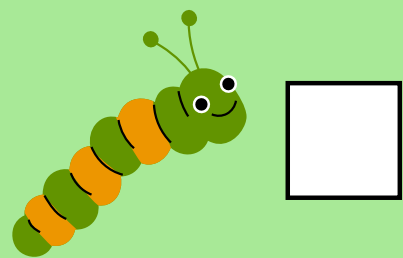
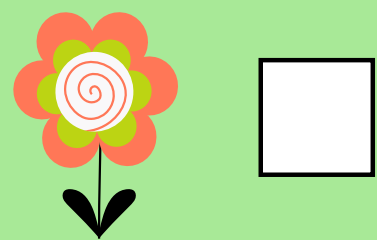
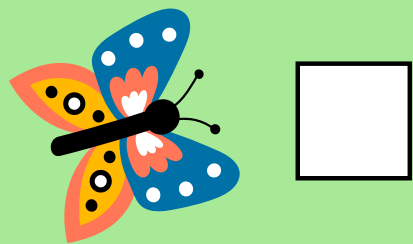
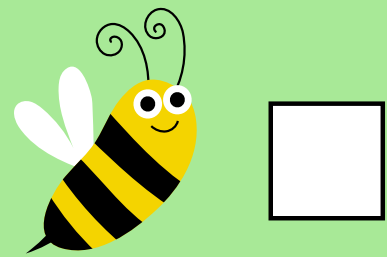
Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

Q: First, tell us something about yourself.

I'm an elementary school teacher, author, and the proud owner of Martin's Children's Books. I've been in education since 2005, and I truly believe that teaching is my calling. Every day, I work with young learners, and that experience inspires everything I create.

I'm also a mom, and that plays a huge role in my work. I understand firsthand how important it is for children to have books that not only teach them but also reflect who they are. My goal is to create meaningful stories that inspire confidence, learning, and a love for reading.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My journey as a writer started in the classroom. I saw my students light up during storytime, but I also noticed that many books didn't fully reflect their experiences or meet all of their learning needs. That's when I decided to start writing my own stories—books in 2020 that combine education with real-life lessons. What began as a small idea grew into Martin's Children's Books, where I now create a variety of children's books, workbooks, and learning tools designed to support early learners.

Q: Tell us something more about your book series.

My books are all connected by a common goal—helping children learn while building confidence and character. Each book focuses on a different area of development, whether it's early literacy, math awareness, self-esteem, or social skills. For example, my newest book, The Polite Parade, teaches children about manners in a fun and engaging way. Many of my books also have companion workbooks or coloring books, so children can interact with what they're learning. I like to think of my collection as more than just books—it's a full learning experience for children, parents, and educators.

Q: How did you create the magical system in your books and characters?

The “magic” in my books isn't about fantasy—it's about real-life transformation. I create characters and stories based on everyday situations that children experience, like being in the classroom, at home, or out in the community.

As a teacher, I design each story with intention, making sure it's both engaging and educational. That combination brings the stories to life.

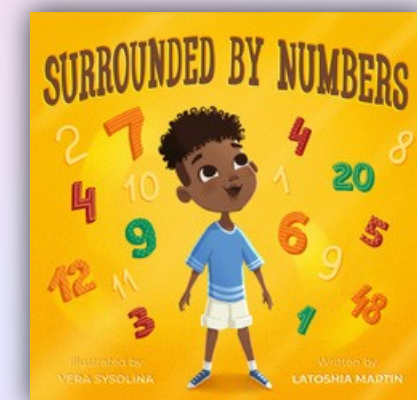
Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

To my young readers, I want you to know that your voice matters, your story matters, and you can achieve anything you set your mind to.

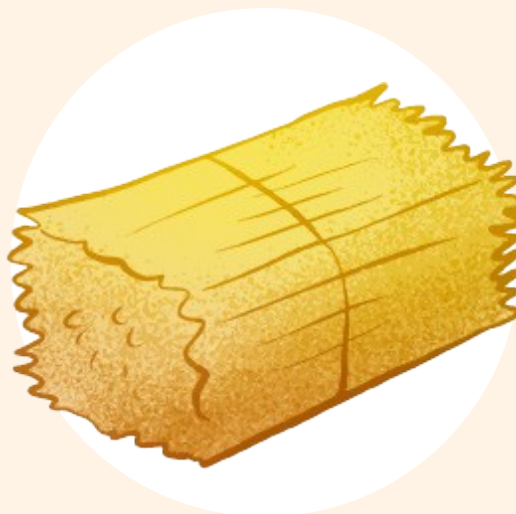
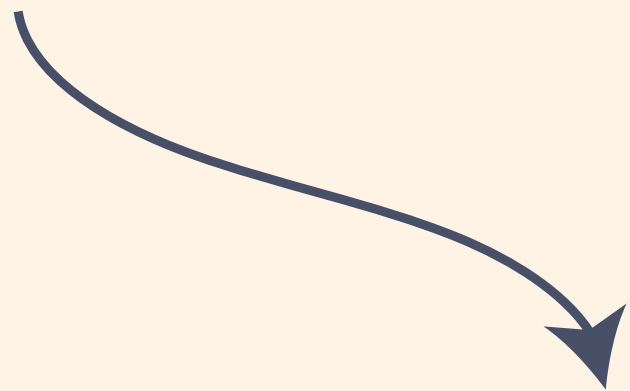

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

My name is Tina Neely, and I am the author and illustrator behind It's Bacon's World!, a heart-centered children's book series inspired by my real pet pig, Bacon. What began as a love for storytelling and a very special pig has grown into a mission-driven brand that reminds children everywhere that they are loved, they belong, and they each have something special to offer the world.

I love creating stories that are playful, interactive, and meaningful for both children and the adults reading with them. Each book invites families to slow down, connect, and search for hidden hearts throughout the illustrations, turning story time into a shared adventure.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My journey really began when I was a little girl. I loved making up stories and dreaming about bringing characters to life, even though spelling and grammar were never my strongest areas. Storytelling, however, always lived in my heart. Years later, when Bacon came into my life, his big personality and loving spirit inspired me to finally put those stories on paper. He reminded me that sometimes the most unexpected gifts can lead us exactly where we are meant to go. My first published book, Bacon Loves Everyone, was born from a true story about Bacon finding his forever family, and from that moment I knew this was only the beginning.

Q: Tell us something more about your book series.

It's Bacon's World! is a growing series of children's books inspired by Bacon and his forever friends. At the heart of every story is a message of love, belonging, kindness, friendship, and faith. The first book, Bacon Loves Everyone, shares Bacon's journey of discovering where he belongs and reminds readers that love has a place for everyone. My upcoming books continue that same heartwarming spirit through new adventures, including bedtime comfort stories, holiday joy, counting concepts, and stories centered around helping others.

One special feature children absolutely love is the hidden heart search woven into every book. In Bacon Loves Everyone alone, there are over 400 hearts hidden throughout the illustrations, making each reading experience interactive and magical.

Q: How did you create the magical system in your books and characters?

The magic in my books comes from the heart. Because Bacon is based on my real pig, each character begins with a real emotion, habit, or personality trait. I build the world around feelings children understand deeply—wanting to belong, wanting to be loved, learning how to give love, and discovering how special they truly are.

The hidden hearts became a visual way to represent that love is always there, even when we do not immediately see it. Every character in Bacon's world has their own playful sounds, movements, and unique personalities, which help children feel like they are stepping into a world that is joyful, safe, and full of wonder. That is the true magic system: love, connection, and imagination working together.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

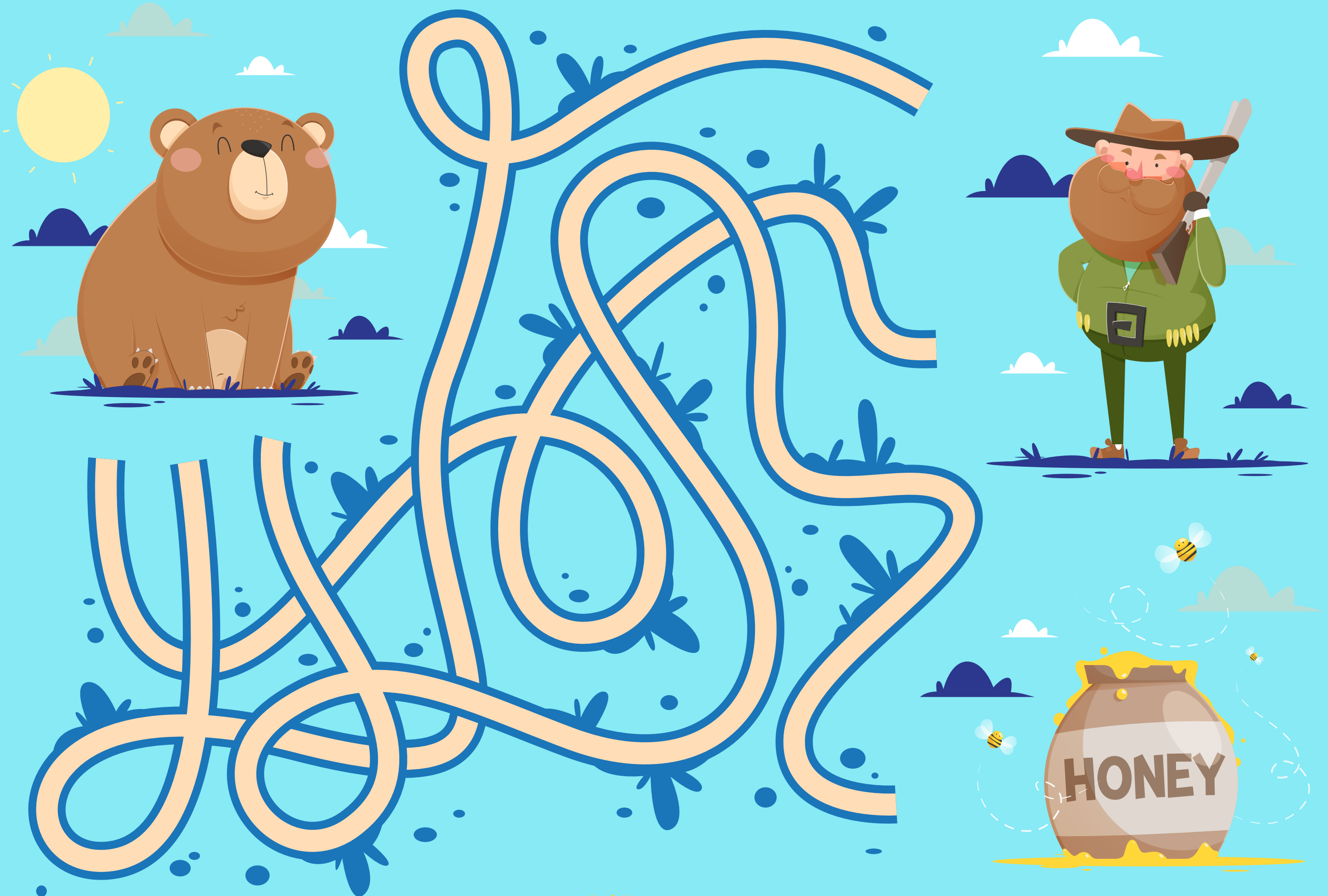
To every child and family reading this, I want you to always remember this: You are loved.

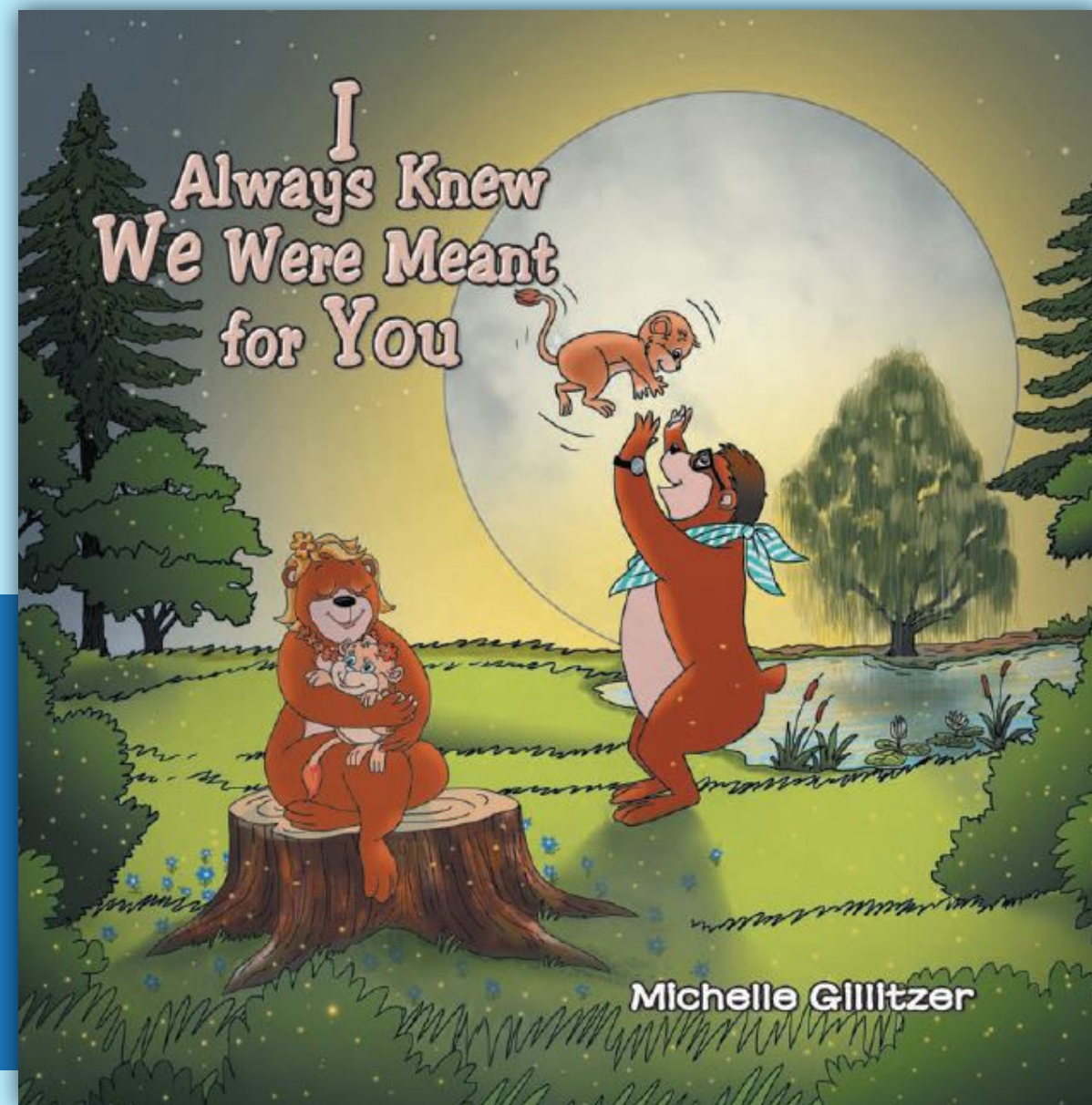


I Always Knew We Were Meant for YOU

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

I am delighted to connect with families and little readers, so thank you for this opportunity! I'm a children's picture book author and storyteller with a deep passion for helping children feel seen, loved, and connected, especially within adoptive families. It is my mission to spread this message that is personal to my heart, as we are on our adoption journey. The inspiration for *I Always Knew We Were Meant for You* was born during the waiting period of our adoption journey. A time when your heart holds an immense, quiet space of love for a child you have not yet met. While we were waiting, my heart ached with longing and hope, and I often found myself thinking about my future children and what this journey might feel like for them. One evening, during a moment of deep reflection, I realized the message I most wanted to give them: that this love was always meant for them, and that our family was destined to find one another. I wanted my child to know that wherever they were in the world, there was a mother and father preparing, believing, and loving them long before we met. This story became my way of saying, *I Always Knew We Were Meant for You*.

This feature feels especially meaningful as it comes during the month we celebrate Mother's Day. As I continue on my own journey toward motherhood, I find myself reflecting on the many forms love can take. I want to honor all mothers, caregivers, and mother figures, and also express deep gratitude for my own mother and grandmothers, whose love and influence have shaped my life in lasting ways.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

My journey as a writer began in childhood, where I loved creating poetic verses and expressing emotions through words. However, I didn't initially set out to become a children's book author, as it was a path I discovered unexpectedly. I began writing a poem for our own future adopted children and decided this message belongs not just for my children but all children awaiting their families. I had a great grandmother that wrote poetry and was very gifted, so perhaps there was inspiration early on.

Q: Tell us something more about your book series.

While I don't yet have a formal book series, my heart is very much centered on expanding this message into a collection of stories. I want to lend support and celebrate families that are formed and brought together in various ways. Each book is created with the intention of nurturing connection, belonging, and emotional understanding for both children and parents.

I also have a second book that I'm preparing to publish, *We Always Know Each Time We See A Rainbow*, which is a deeply personal tribute to families who have experienced miscarriage or child loss. This story was written to offer comfort, remembrance, and gentle hope to those walking through grief. My hope is to share my personal message of faith and healing, so others can find pieces of their story reflected, honored, and held with love.

Q: How did you create the magical system in your books and characters?

I believe the true magic comes from a divine love guided through a spiritual connection. I believe in the quiet, powerful sense that families are brought together with this intention and love. In writing these stories, I leaned into faith, God's love, trust, and the idea that every child's journey is guided in ways we may not always see, but can always feel. Children naturally understand the world through wonder and emotion, so I wanted the message to feel gentle, comforting, and true to that perspective.

The characters are a reflection of our journey, while the illustrations capture some spiritual messages and experiences aligned in our journey. Most importantly, I wanted the characters' home to reflect a space of warmth, safety, and to help children experience a sense of comfort and joyous welcoming.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

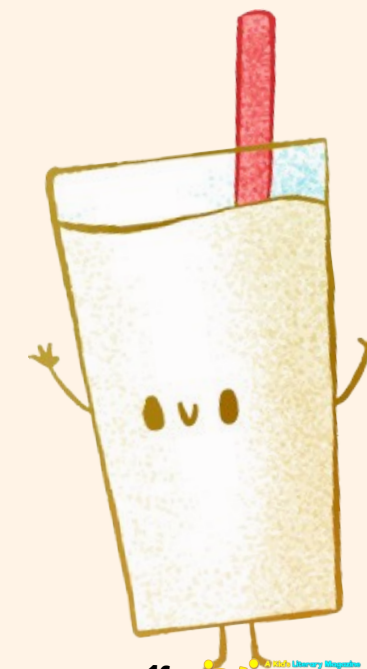
You were always meant to be part of a story filled with love. To every child and family who reads *I Always Knew We Were Meant For You*, my hope is that you feel a sense of love, belonging, and connection within its pages. There is something so meaningful about sharing this message with all children, especially those on an adoption journey or within the foster community. My hope is that these stories offer comfort, reassurance, and a sense of belonging, while also supporting parents and caregivers. No matter how a family comes together, it is that love that is worth celebrating every day.

Perfect for families, schools, and counselors, this story opens the door for important conversations about loss, healing, and the power of community.



Q: First tell us something about yourself.

I am a mother, wife, and teacher. I became a published author on July 15, 2025. I am someone who is determined, carries a quiet strength, and wears my heart on my sleeve.

My favorite season is fall—the beautiful colors and the perfect in-between weather, not too warm and not too cold. I live in Long Island, New York, where I enjoy taking long drives and exploring all the island has to offer.

Above all, I love my family, my friends, and teaching. Inspiring others is what I truly believe I was born to do.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

I've always had a love for writing—especially rhymes and poetry, which began in middle school. I continued that passion through high school, where I took honors courses, and into college, where I wrote for the college newspaper.

I contributed opinion pieces, often focusing on fashion and trending topics around campus. Along the way, I also found myself editing peers' assignments and later helping others with resumes. Somehow, in one way or another, writing has always been a part of who I am.

Q: Tell us something more about your book series.

This book was crafted with love to honor my brother. Up, Up, Up is a heartfelt children's book that tenderly follows young Eli in the days after the loss of his beloved "Uncle Bryan," Honorary Chief Bryant Ortiz—depicted as a real-life superhero. Through Eli's eyes, readers are gently guided through themes of grief, hope, remembrance, and resilience. There is a strong, loving community of support depicted with an outpouring amount of firetrucks, ambulances, and helicopters that symbolize comfort. I have this available in English and in Spanish. I also have activity books to match the theme.

My second book, The Power Of Me! ¡El poder de mí! has a connection with my first book. Eli showed bravery and strength which was inferred but this second book shows how "he" empowered himself and his mother. From whispered prayers to daily affirmations, one mother pours strength, courage, and belief into her son—reminding him that he is brave, capable, worthy, and never alone. This is a bilingual book, English & Spanish.

Over time, those affirmations take root, growing with him and becoming the strong foundation he carries within himself. Then something beautiful happens. When life presents challenges, the strength she once poured into him becomes the very power he gives back to her. "The Power of Me" celebrates the lasting impact of positive words and love spoken aloud.

This book also includes self-affirmations, discussion questions for grades K–5, to help children continue building confidence, kindness, and belief in themselves.

Q: How did you create the magical system in your books and characters?

The images and characters in my book are deeply personal, representing myself, my brother Bryant, my son Eli, and even my husband, who makes a special appearance. The story begins as a memory, when Eli was about two years old, and gently unfolds into the experience of losing his uncle. Through the illustrations, you'll notice a subtle transformation—Eli's features evolving from a soft, baby-like face into a more toddler-like appearance, reflecting both time and emotional growth.

Each illustration was created using a blend of Canva and AI, bringing real images to life through intentional edits. This applies to both books.

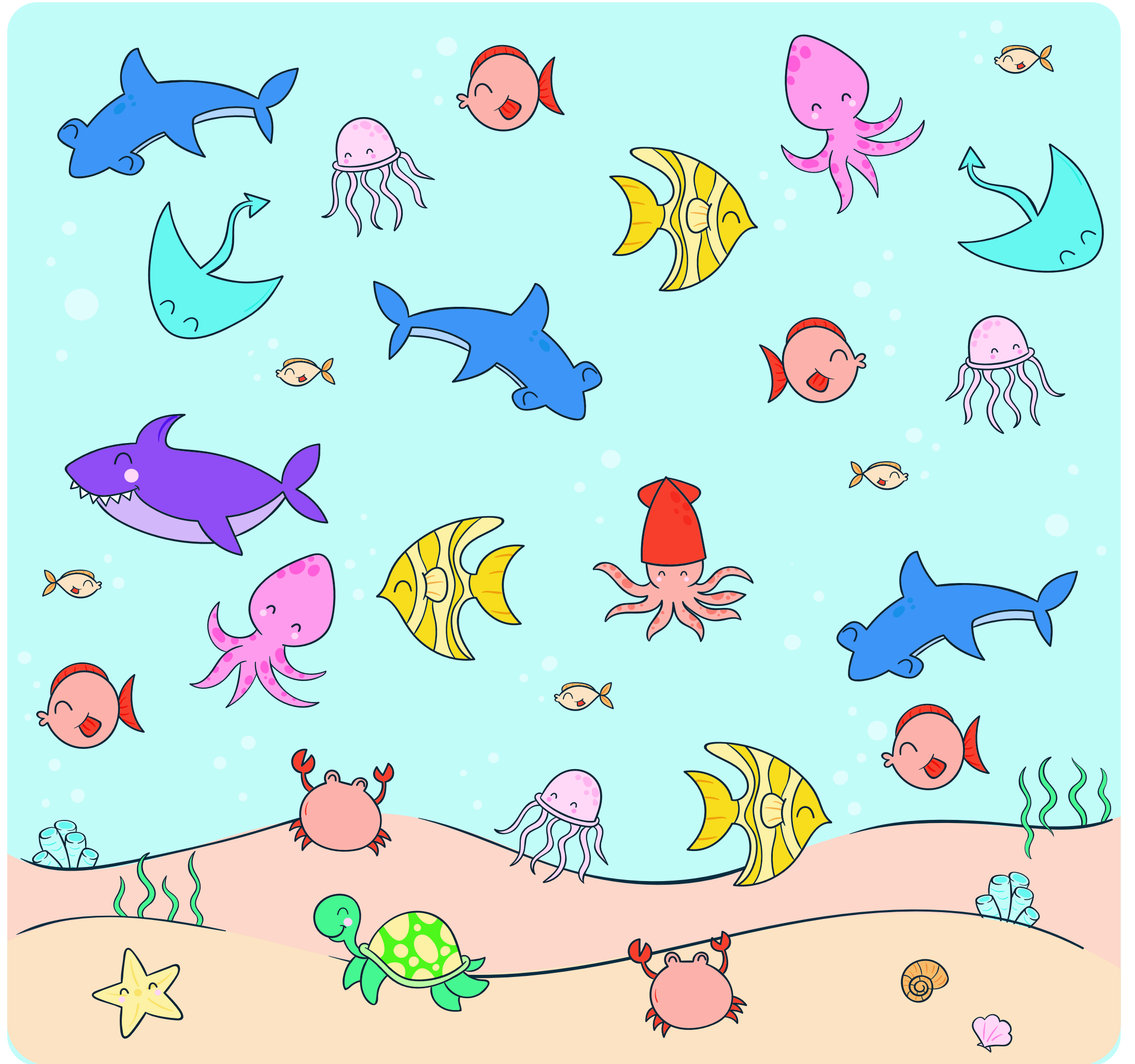
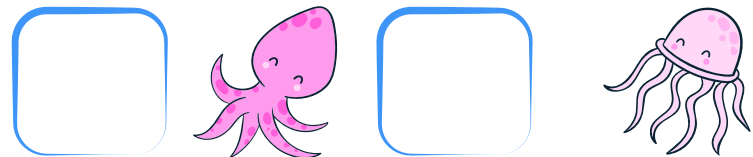
Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?

I want my readers to know that they are kind, brave, strong, and deeply loved. I want children to understand that they are not alone in their feelings, and that love continues even after loss. You should always express your emotions—your voice matters.

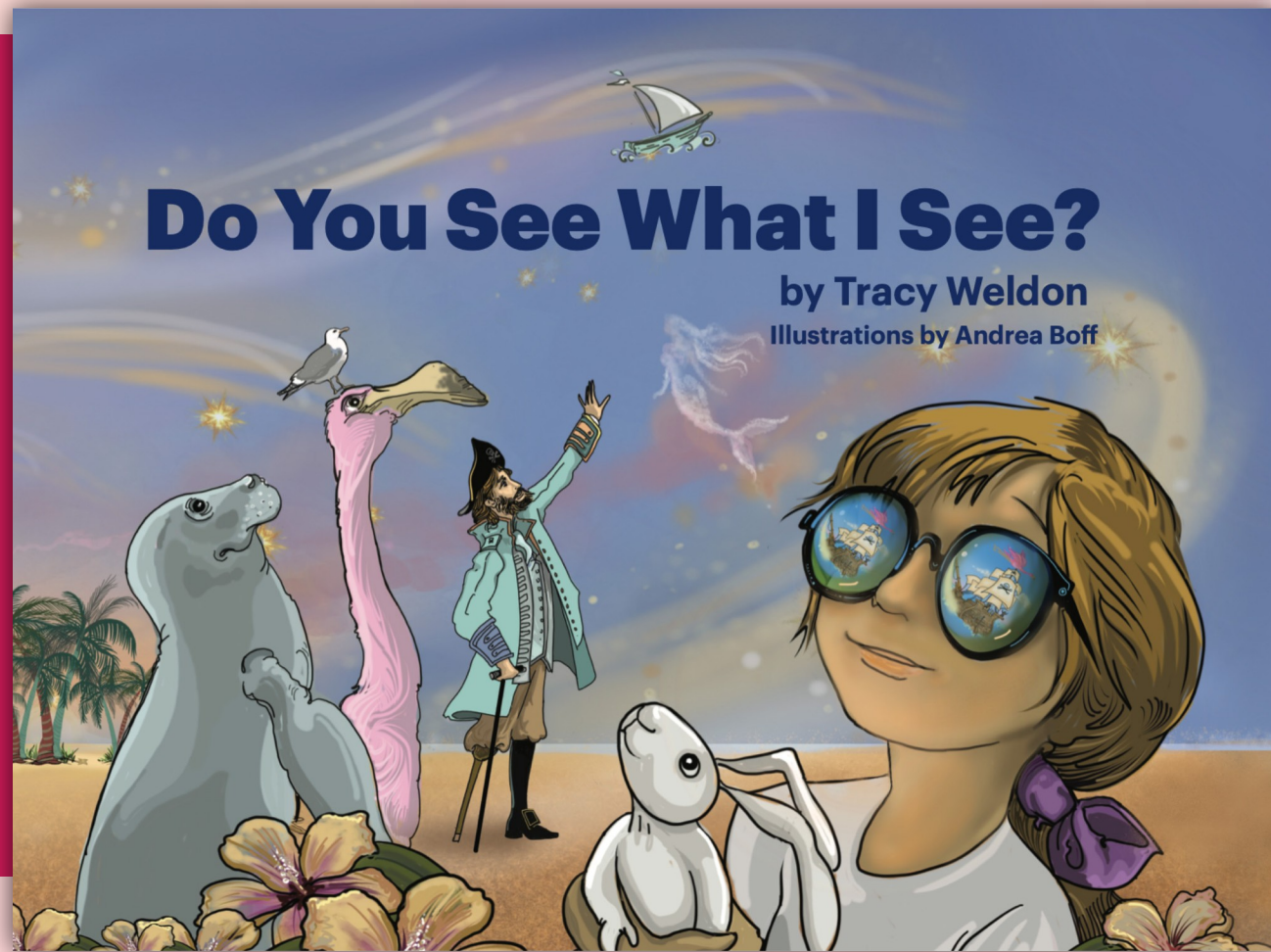
If you are impacted by loss, grief, or sadness, honor those feelings and the ones you love. Look at their pictures, create a memorial, visit their resting place, share beautiful memories, and write your thoughts down.

Remember, words matter—they stay with us forever. Actions, love, and legacy live on as well. With each moment, each memory, and each feeling, you are creating a masterpiece—one piece of the puzzle at a time.

Do You See What I See?



When a grandparent asks, "Do you see what I see?" an ordinary moment opens into a world of wonder. With each turn of the page, a child's imagination takes flight and soon the grown-ups aren't just watching, they're joining in.

Told with warmth and playful perspective, *Do You See What I See?* is a joyful celebration of how children see the world and how their vision helps us remember the magic in the everyday.

This story honors imagination, connection, and the beautiful truth that children are often the best teachers of joy. Perfect for grandparents, parents, and children to share together, this tender story is a reminder: Sometimes the smallest eyes help us see the biggest wonders.

Q: First tell us something about yourself.

I am a children's book author passionate about storytelling, creativity, and literacy. Before writing for children, I co-founded and led an international creative agency, where I helped global brands tell meaningful stories. After selling my company, I returned to what first inspired me as a child, storytelling. I studied children's literature at the University of Chicago Graham School and began writing picture books inspired by my two sons. Today, I create stories that nurture imagination, encourage kindness, and spark connection between children and the adults in their lives.

Q: How and when did your journey start as a writer?

Children's books have always had a profound impact on me. As a child, I was captivated by their ability to transport me to new worlds while helping me understand big emotions. Writing found me early. I always felt I could express myself most clearly on paper, and I loved creating stories. That passion continued through my career, where I wrote as a national magazine columnist, published nonfiction books, and contributed to journals. After selling my marketing company, I returned fully to storytelling and studied children's literature at the University of Chicago Graham School. Today, I feel incredibly grateful to share stories that reach homes, classrooms, and libraries.

Q: Tell us something more about your book series.

Do You See What I See? begins with a simple question that opens into a world of imagination. What starts as an ordinary moment quickly transforms as a child's perspective takes over, inviting readers to see beyond what is in front of them.

With each page turn, the imagination deepens and the grown-ups move from observing to participating. The story becomes a shared experience of wonder. At its heart, the book celebrates how children see the world and reminds us that their perspective can help us rediscover joy, creativity, and connection in everyday life.

Q: How did you create the magical system in your books and characters?

The magic of the book is built through its structure and pacing. The illustrator and I designed a rhythm where the right-hand pages show the grandparents' view of an ordinary moment, and each page turn opens into the child's imagination across the full spread. This creates a pattern of contrast and discovery that gently shifts perspective. The repeated line, "Do you see what I see?" evolves over the course of the story, moving from curiosity to connection. By the end, it transforms into "I see what you see," and finally into "Do you feel what I feel?" This progression reflects the deeper emotional arc of the story, moving from simply seeing to truly understanding and sharing an experience.

Q: Do you want to leave any message for your readers?
